## Consequence Delivery System Executive Summary

The United States Border Patrol's ability to impose consequences on those entering the United States illegally varies greatly between each state, judicial district, and Border Patrol sector. Each area has unique circumstances that afford the Border Patrol a wide range of applicable consequences in response to cross border illegal activity.

In order to evaluate the effectiveness and efficiency of each of the consequences, the Office of Border Patrol convened a workgroup of subject matter experts from each of the nine Southwest Border Sectors, which developed a comprehensive Analysis of Alternatives matrix. This matrix is designed with the intent to provide a thorough process by which these consequences can be analyzed, and to maximize how they are effectively, efficiently, and systematically applied. A number of factors were taken into consideration and weighed accordingly based on standards of evaluation found in Performance Measurement and Program Management. These factors were categorized into three broad areas for analysis; the cost of each consequence to the Border Patrol, the schedule in which the consequence is applied and the time associated with each application, and the overall performance and result of applying each consequence to specific groups of amenable aliens.

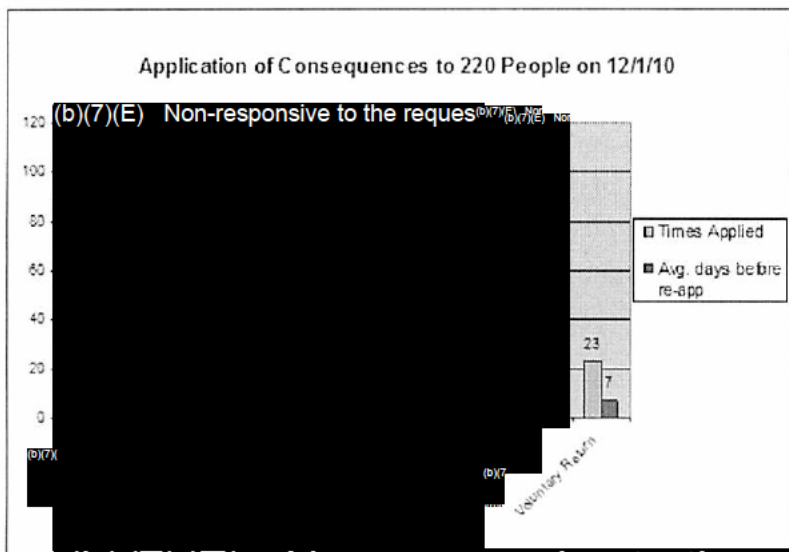
Based on operational requirements, the Office of Border Patrol focused on the Tucson Sector for the initial implementation of a decision tool for leadership and agents in the field. After the Tucson Sector completed their Analysis of Alternatives matrix, which was supported by relevant documentation and data, a team of headquarters staff in consultation with the Tucson Sector developed a comprehensive, yet easy to use guide for agents in the field, which integrates an evaluation process for identifying and classifying aliens and the analysis



of effectiveness and efficiency of the consequences. This guide, entitled, "Consequence Delivery System Guide and Evaluation Process," is designed to be a single handout or poster, which can be quickly distributed to agents in the field. This guide is sector specific and can be used at the point of processing to enhance the ability and inform the decision of agents to classify aliens and choose the best consequence available. The guide also encourages the combination of consequences to achieve the most effective outcome, based on amenability of the alien and the capacity of each consequence.

Although the number of apprehensions in the Tucson Sector may initially prohibit the application of the most effective an efficient consequence to every alien, the continued decrease in apprehensions and the increase in the capacity of the consequences to accommodate the volume will lead to a more accurate and comprehensive analysis of the effect each consequence has on each classification of alien. In order to address this issue and to implement the guide and evaluation process in a timely and manner, the Office of Border Patrol is recommending an aggressive implementation schedule, beginning January 1, 2011 in the Tucson Sector. The guide and evaluation process will incorporate built-in evaluation periods and revisions, which will reflect the most current data and analysis available.

For example, in a single day, December 1, 2010, two-hundred and twenty (220) people were apprehended in the Tucson Sector area of responsibility (excluding aliens with special circumstances, medical/humanitarian issues and juveniles) and received one or more of the available consequences.

Of the 220 people apprehended that received a consequence, only 17 (8%) were re-apprehended between December 1 and December 14, 2010. Those 17 people collectively received four of the eight consequences available and utilized on that day; Expedited Removal, Alien Transfer and Exit Program, Reinstatement, and Voluntary Return. The average time between the initial apprehension and application of a consequence and the re-apprehension of those 17 people was eight (8) days. Aliens that received any of the other six consequences on December 1, 2010, have not been re-apprehended.

Based on the information above, the current iteration of the guide and its relevance are confirmed. Four of the consequences that fall on the lower end of effectiveness and efficiency, resulted in additional apprehension within a short period of the initial apprehension. The implementation of the Consequence Delivery System Guide will assist in identifying the most effective and efficient consequences, while applying them in a consistent and systematic way to achieve the greatest impact.







On March 17, 2010 at approximately 4:00 am, an illegal alien being held at the Law Enforcement Center claimed that he and two of his companions, also held at the LEC, were robbed on March 14, 2010 in (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) Mexico. There was also a third companion but he claimed that he was not robbed because he had no money. The four illegal aliens were part of a group of 14 aliens from Mexico who illegally entered the United States on March 16, 2010 and were apprehended the same day near (b)(7)(E) Arizona.

The subject who made the claim was identified as (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) and he was born on (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) in (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) Mexico where he and his friends currently reside. (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) is an unaccompanied juvenile who traveled from his residence with his three adult friends to (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) Mexico. They attempted to cross the border on March 12, 2010 but were unsuccessful and returned to (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) the same day with the intention of returning to Veracruz. **SUBJECT:** Possible Bandit Activity

On February 9, 2010 at 2:30AM I received a call from BPA [REDACTED] stating that he had just arrested an alien who claimed that he was robbed a few hours earlier while walking north along the San Pedro River. The alien (identified as [REDACTED] C.O.B. Mexico, D.O.B. [REDACTED] was transported to the station for processing and interviewing.

Once [REDACTED] arrived at the station he was interviewed as to what happened concerning this alleged robbery and he stated the following;

[REDACTED] crossed in the desert near Douglas, AZ on February 7, 2010. A guide led him to a stash house at an unknown location. He stayed in the house overnight with three other people (two males and a pregnant female). The next day, a second guide drove the four of them to [REDACTED] at the river. He said that they all exited the vehicle and began walking northbound. [REDACTED] stated that he was told they were supposed to walk for three to four hours. Shortly after they began walking, [REDACTED] stated that the guide (who they called [REDACTED]) pulled out a small silver pistol, aimed it at him and instructed him to give him his money, "or else". [REDACTED] described the guide as a younger Hispanic male that had a lighter complexion, was wearing a Dodgers jacket and was in possession of a silver gun. [REDACTED] said that while (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) was robbing another member of the group, he fled the area. [REDACTED] stated that he made his way back to the road [REDACTED] and saw that the vehicle they had arrived in was gone. He waited there until the Agents found him there on the side of the road

(b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated that the individual that robbed him took 3,000 pesos off of his person. He also stated that he had previously paid \$2,000 U.S. dollars to another member of the smuggling organization to cross him in to the United States. (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated that his final destination was to be New Jersey. (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) says that he does not know what happened to the other three members of the group, and did not see them again after he fled the scene of the robbery. (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated that he was not harmed in any way during the encounter.

After he was interviewed, (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) was enrolled into the e3/IDENT/IAFIS systems. IAFIS revealed no prior criminal history and a minimal immigration history. (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) spoke with Officer (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) of the Mexican Consulate's Office in Douglas, AZ. (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) was granted a voluntary return through the (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) AZ Port Of Entry.
