On the following pages we provide the results of an exploratory factor analysis as well as charts depicting the percentage of respondents that experience either belonging, ambiguity, or exclusion by a series of demographic and individual factors.

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Exploratory Factor Analysis

As previously reported, we performed a series of five factor analyses to determine whether the Belonging Barometer could detect a latent variable that captured the experience of belonging across different life settings and went beyond the distinct experiences of co-creation, psychological safety, and social connection that the scale items specifically addressed.

Across life settings, we found no evidence of latent subscales capturing co-creation, psychological safety, or social cohesion. Instead, responses to all ten items of the Belonging Barometer followed a pattern that suggests that the experience of belonging goes beyond what the items are explicitly measuring.

The following tables provide the component coefficients for each item of the Belonging Barometer, across life settings, in descending order from those that account for the most variability in the data to the least. *Note: (R) denotes that the item is reverse-scored in the tables below.

We also provide the Cronbach's alphas for those that are interested.

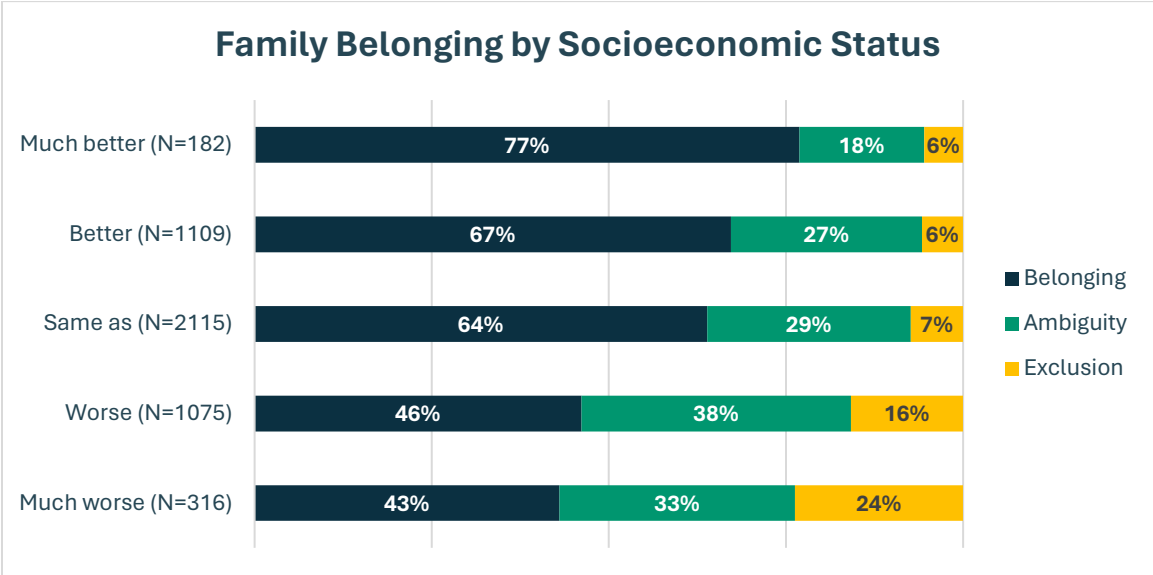

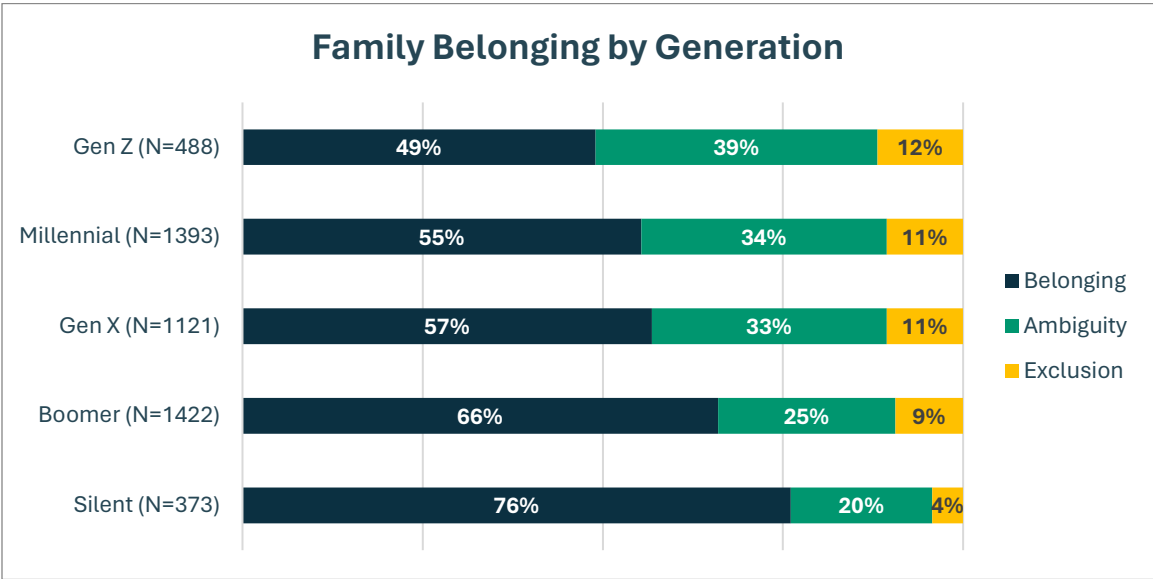

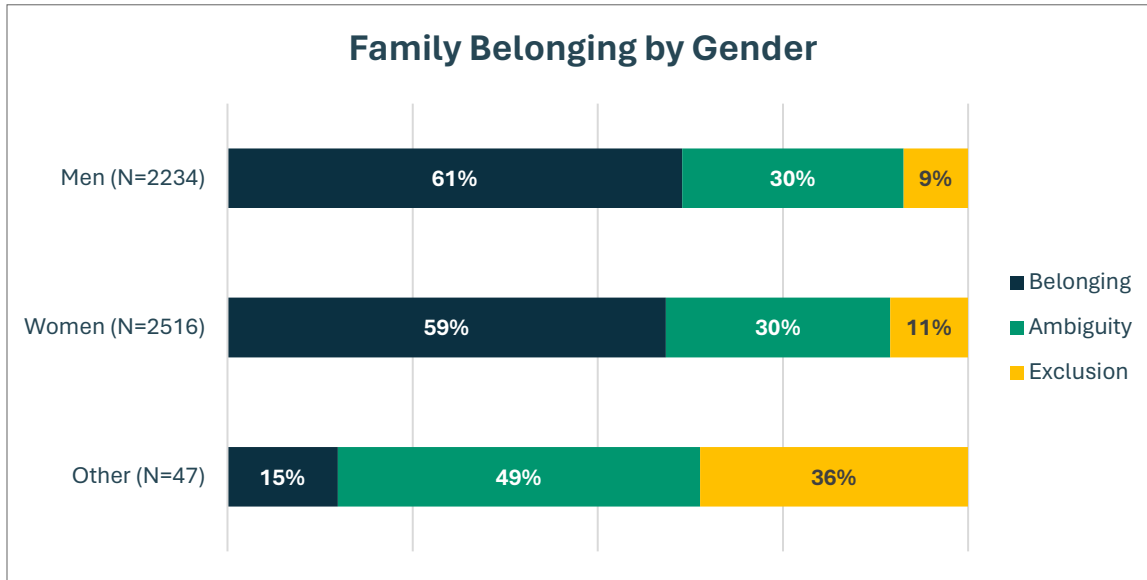
Family Belonging by Socioeconomic Status



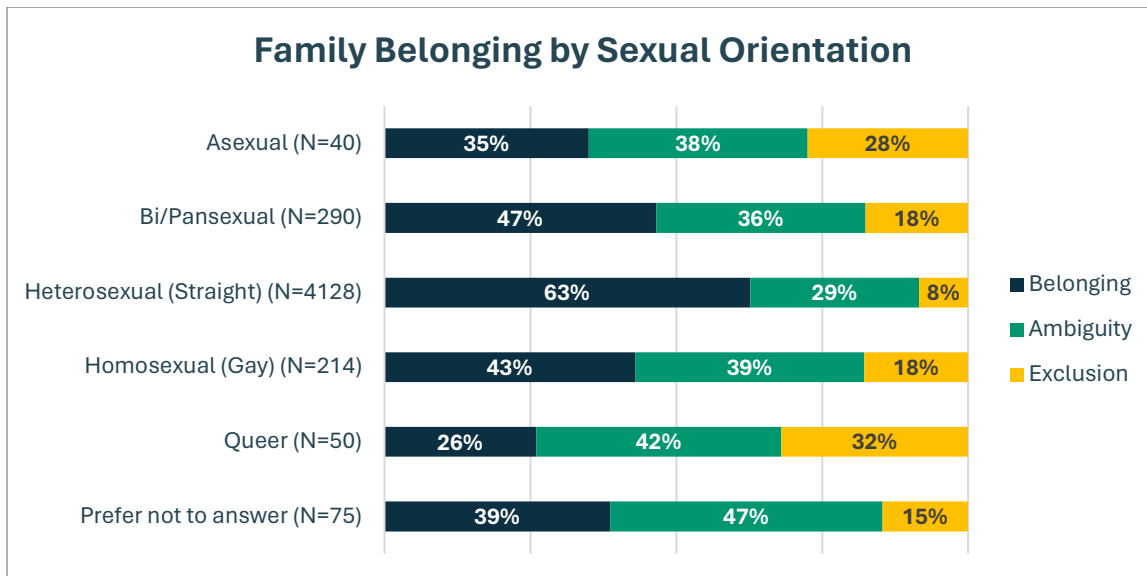
Family Belonging by Generation



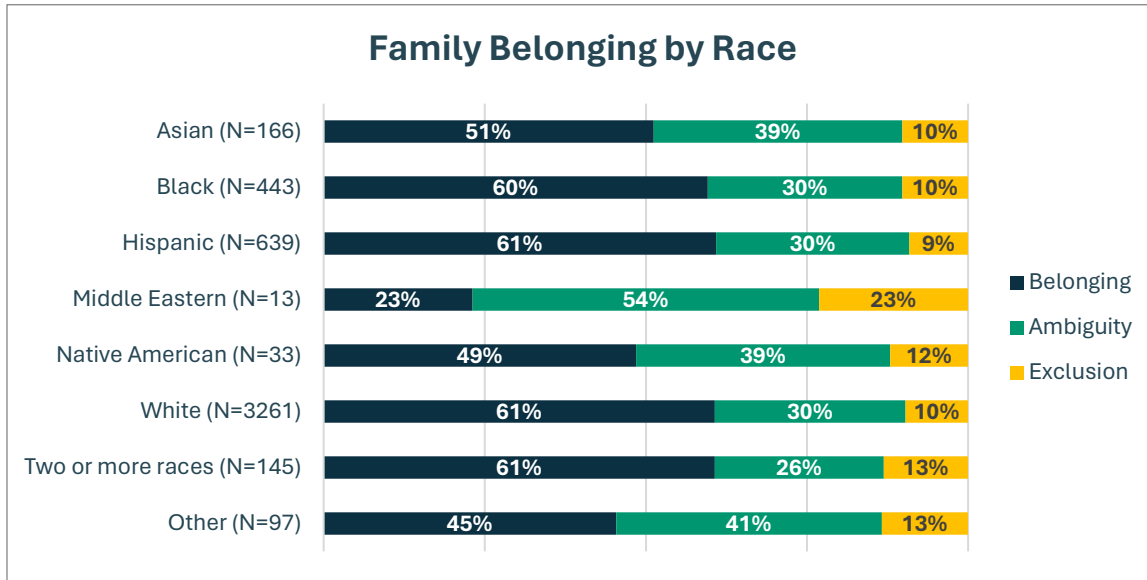
Family Belonging by Gender



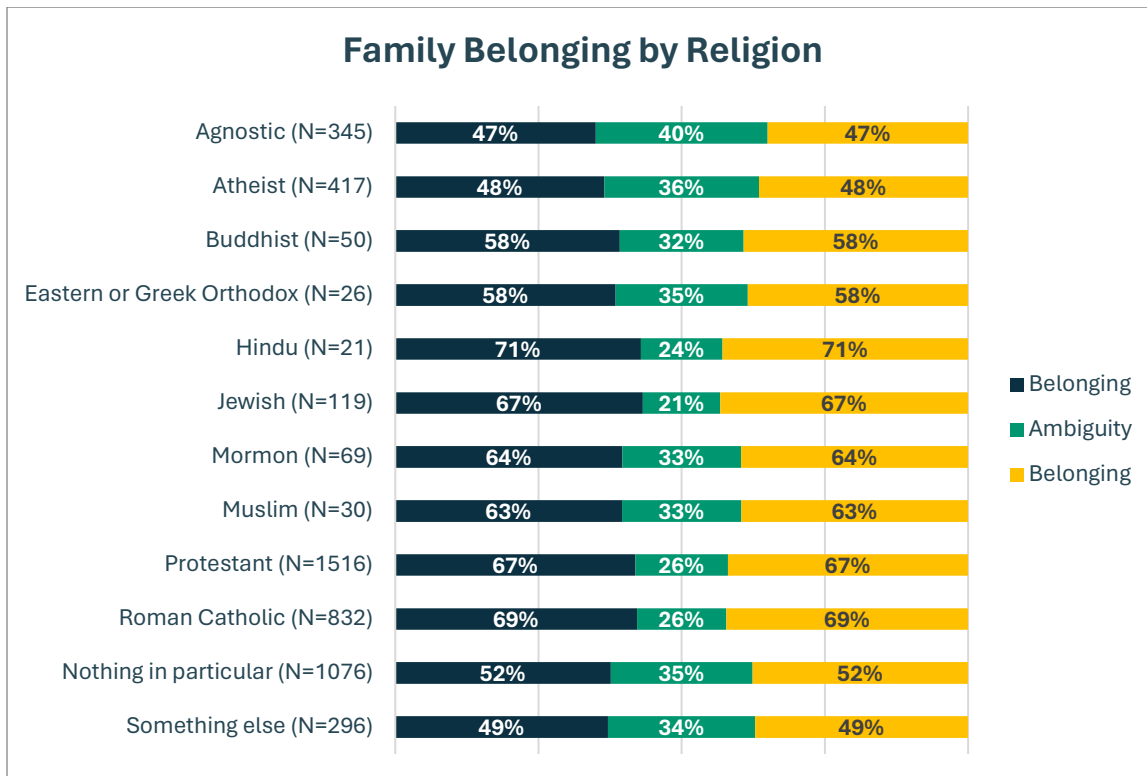
Family Belonging by Sexual Orientation



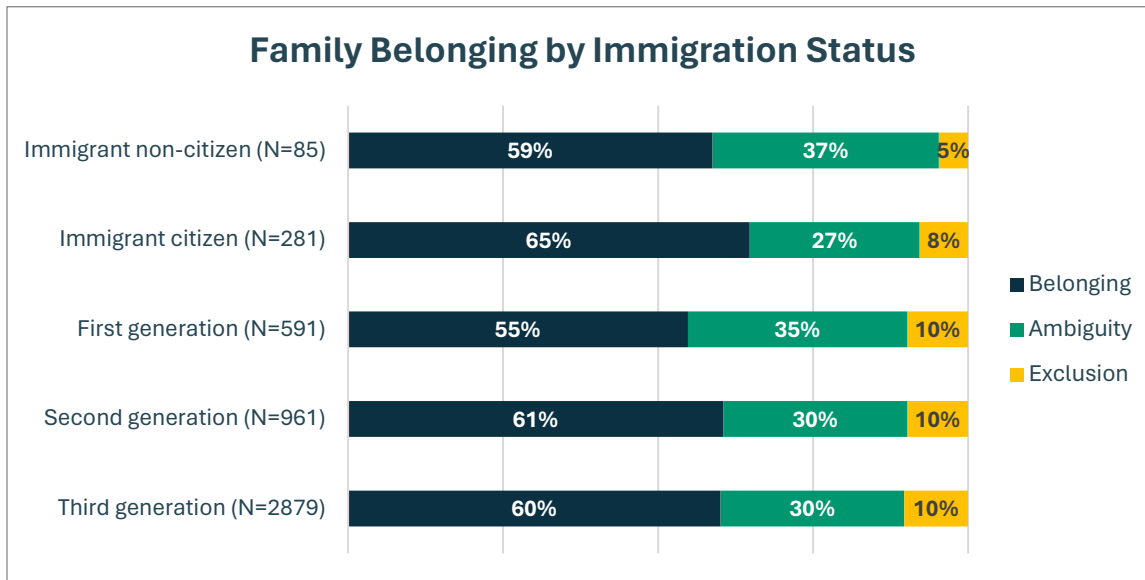

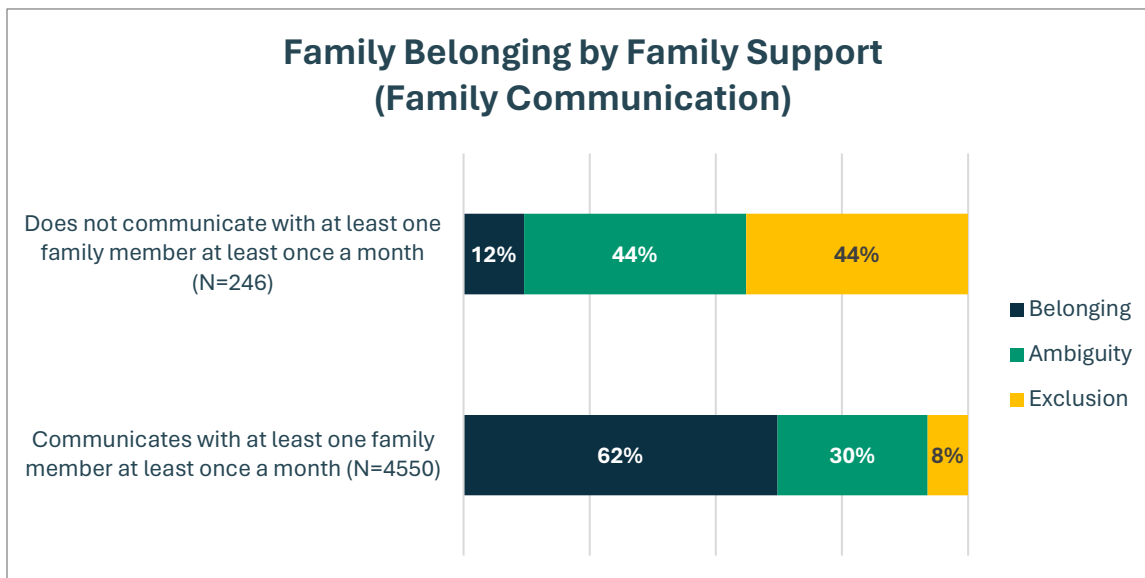

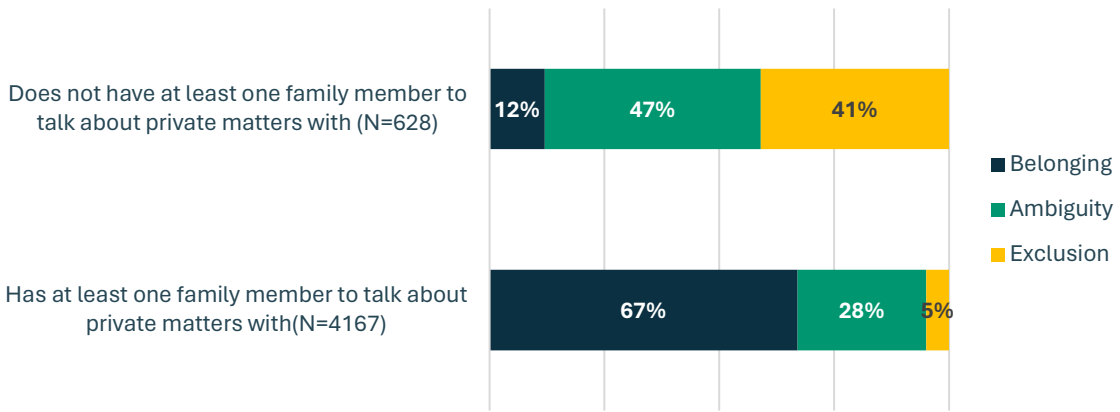


Family Belonging by Family Support

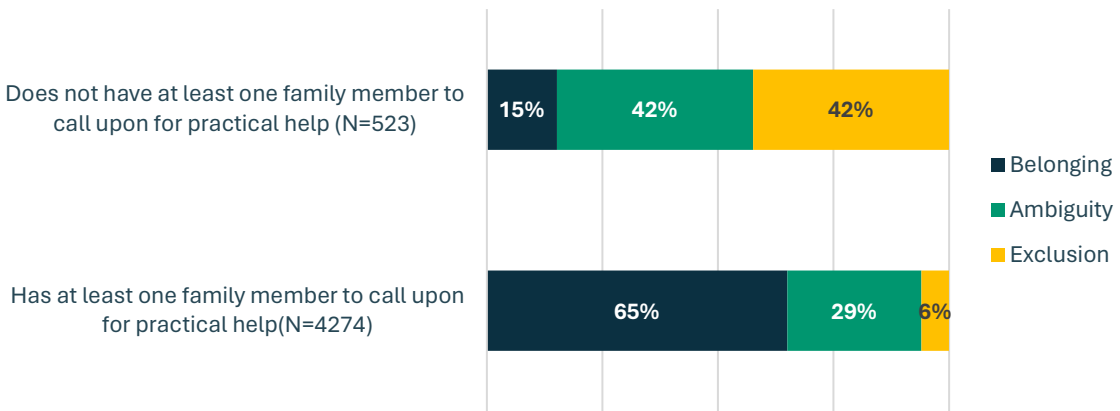
Family support was measured using three items that assessed the extent to which respondents had family members that they could communicate with at least once a month, call upon to discuss private matters, and/or ask for practical help. Respondents indicated the number of family members that they had that could provide each kind of support.



Family Belonging by Family Support (Family Confidant)

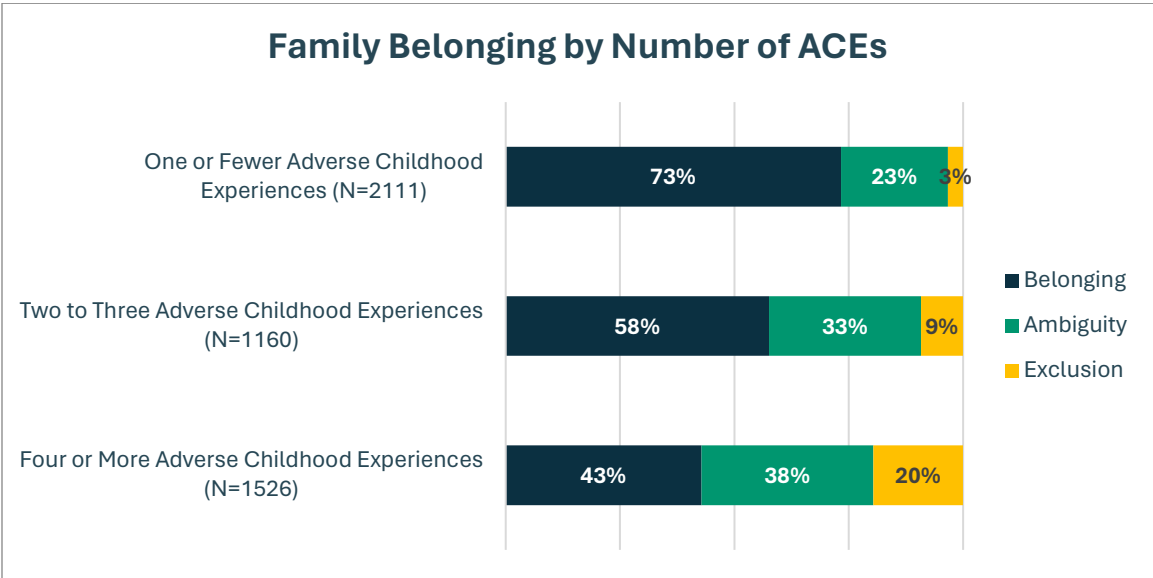


Family Belonging by Family Support (Family Help)



Family Belonging by Number of Adverse Childhood Experiences

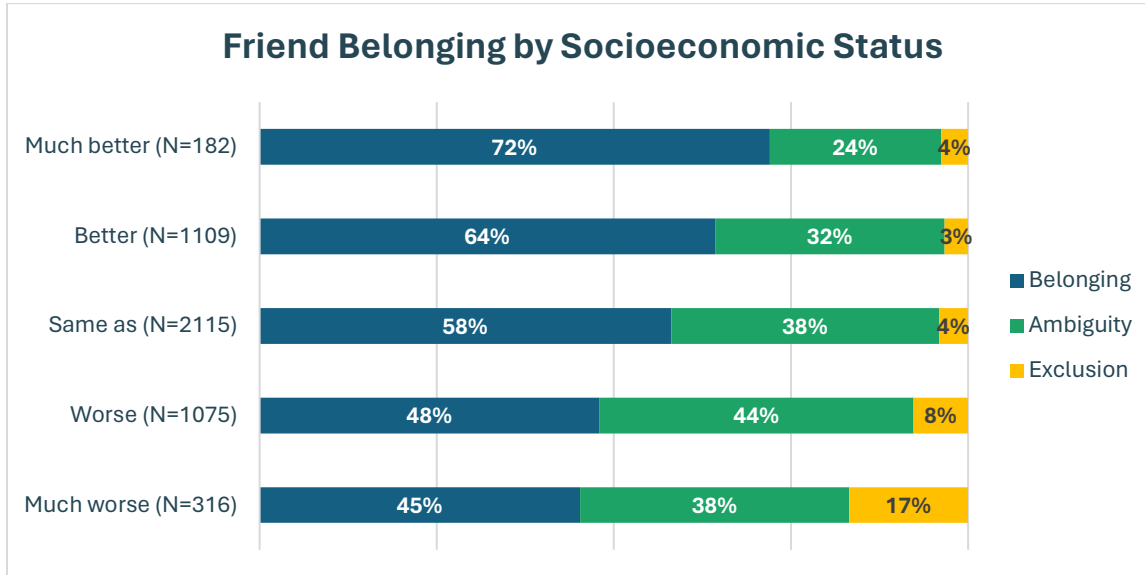
Adverse childhood experiences (ACEs) are those such as abuse and neglect that are related to negative outcomes later in life ([World Health Organization, 2018](#)).



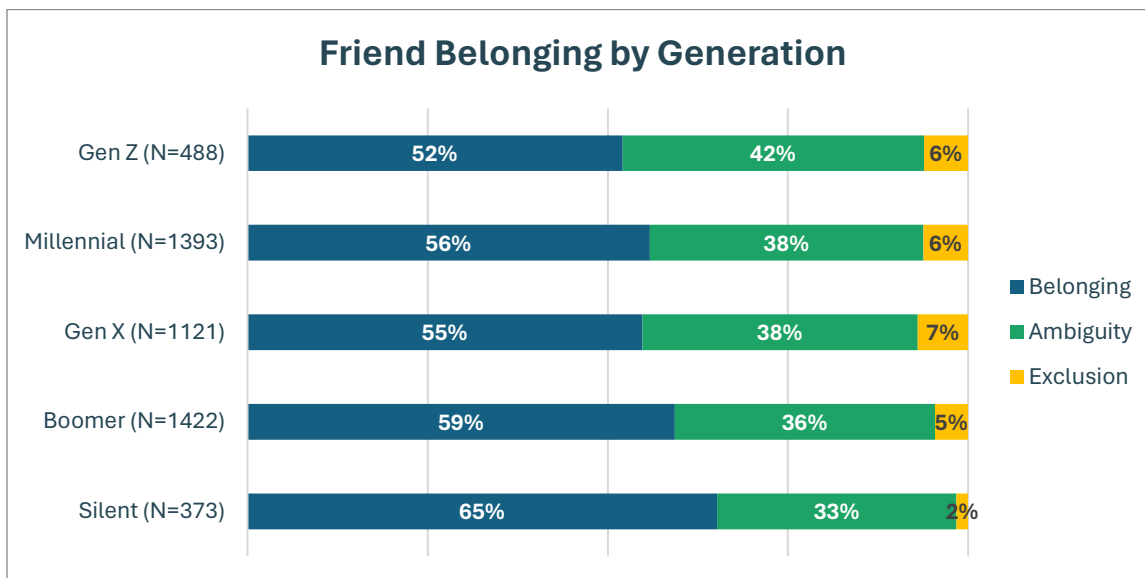

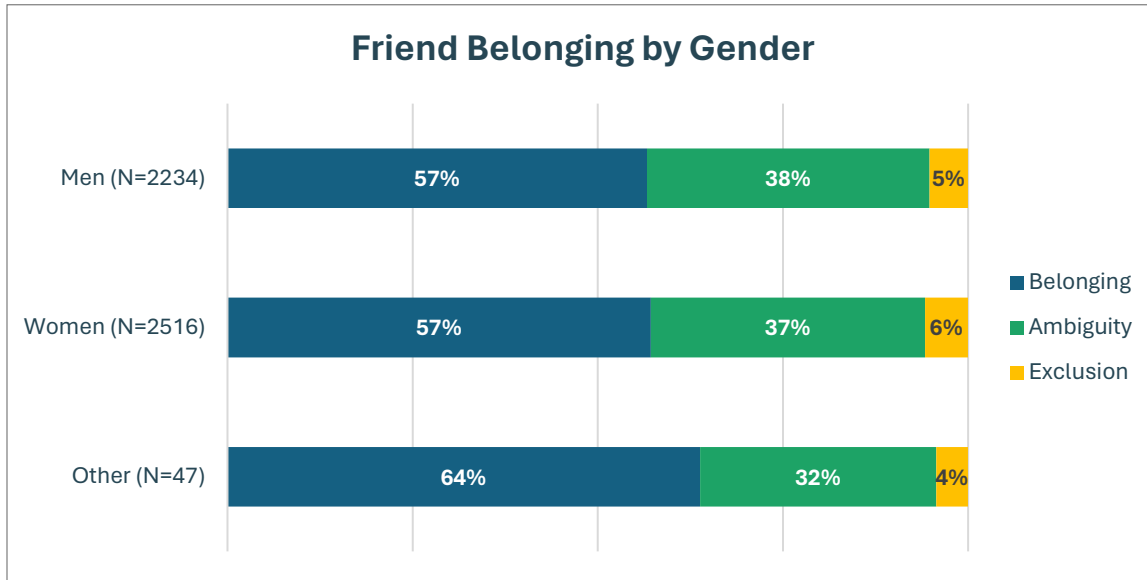
Friend Belonging by Socioeconomic Status



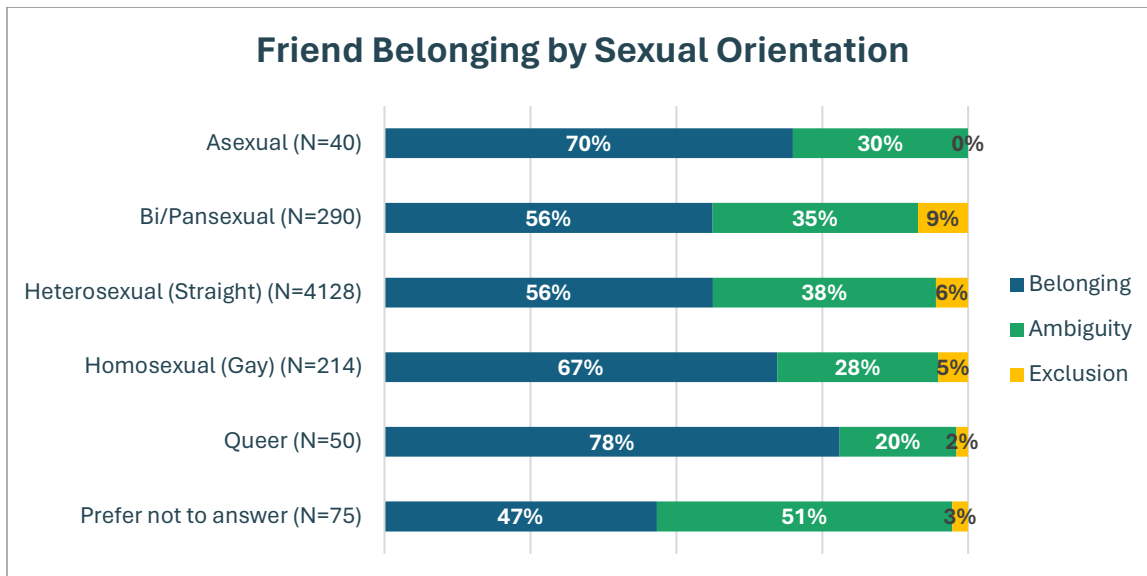
Friend Belonging by Generation



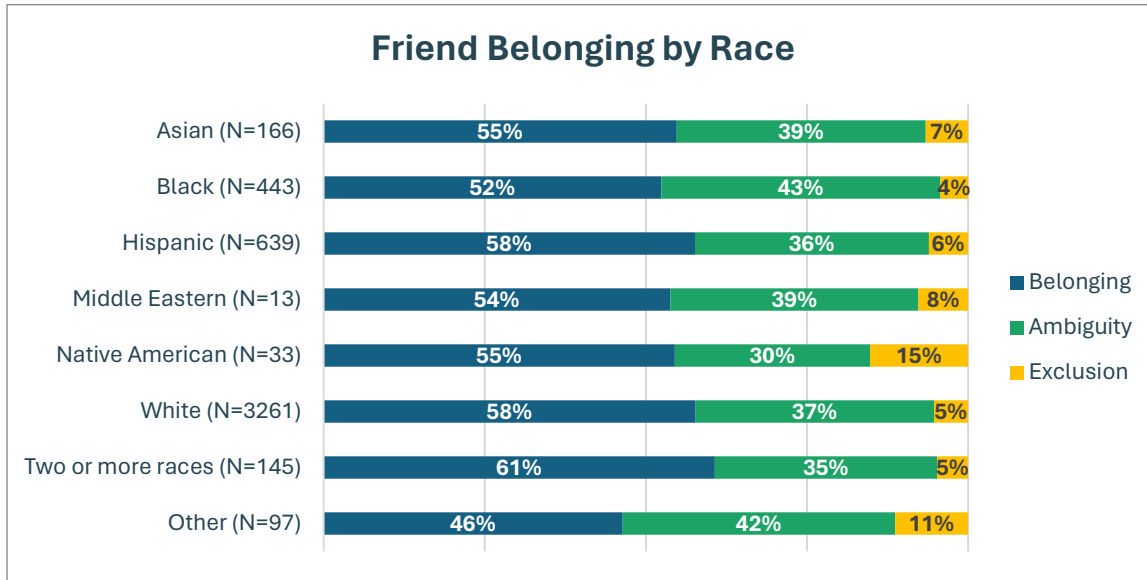
Friend Belonging by Gender



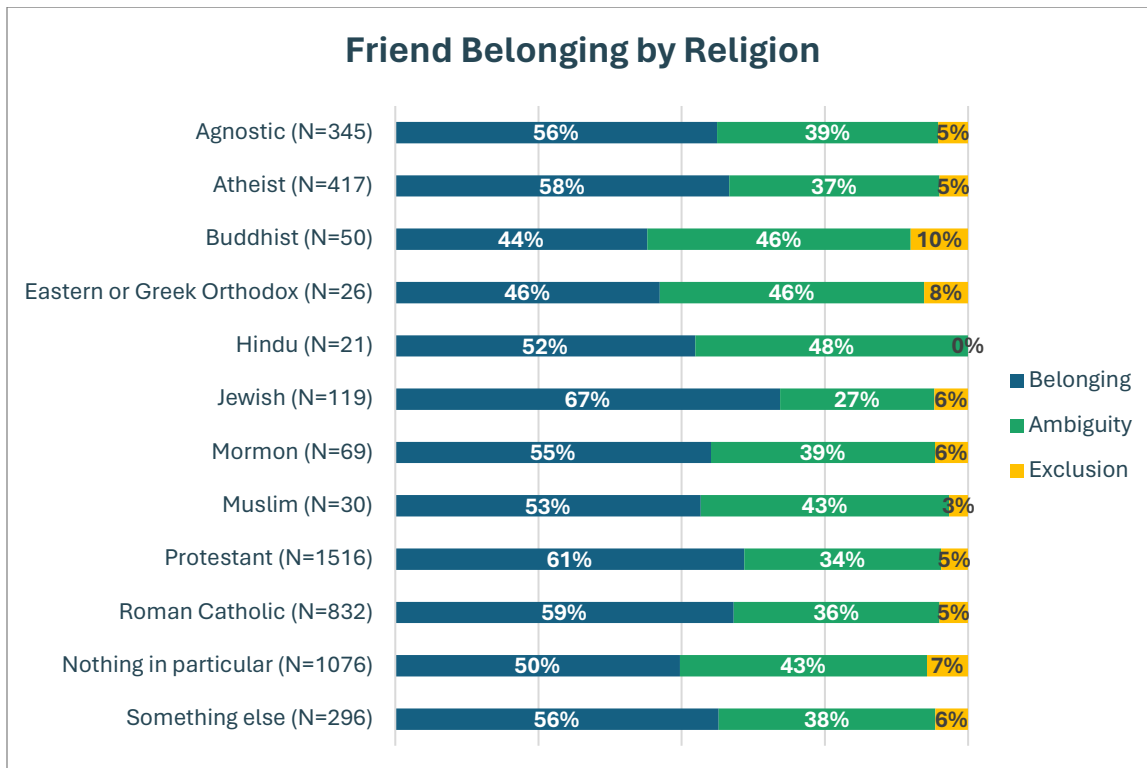
Friend Belonging by Sexual Orientation



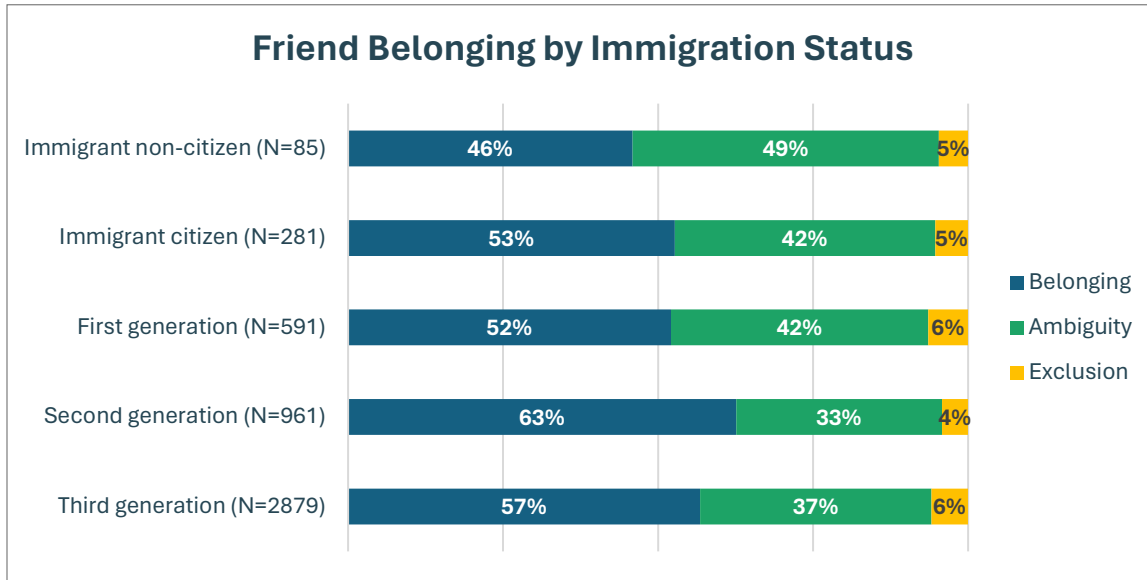

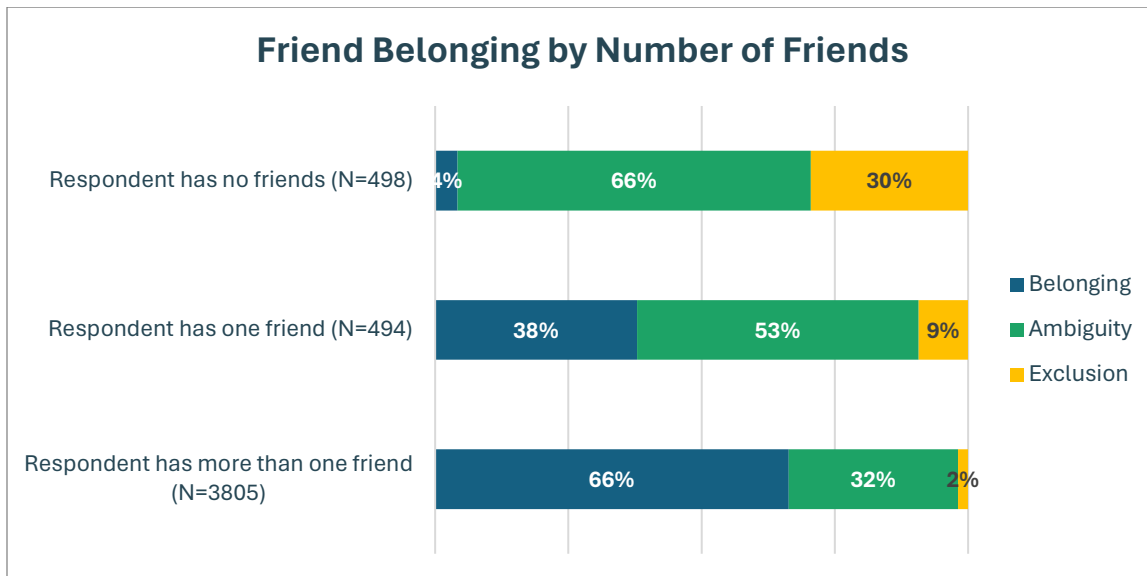

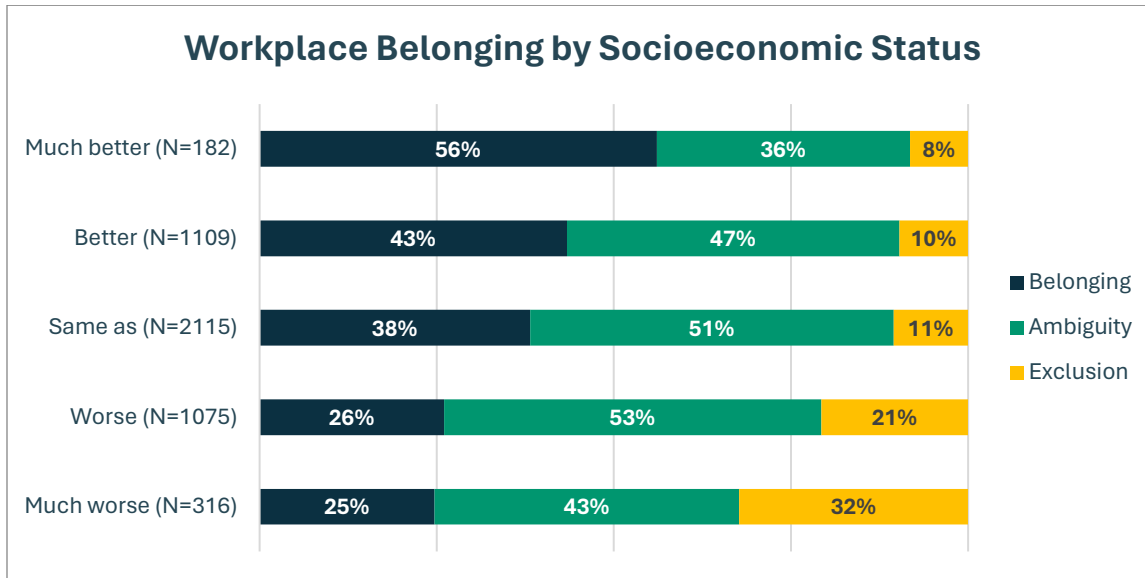

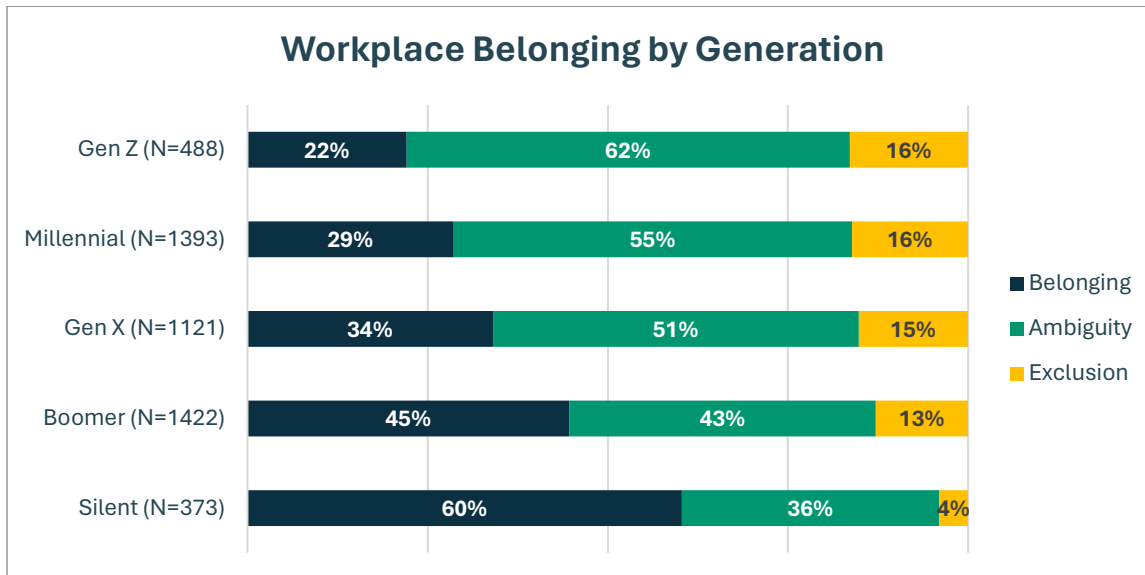

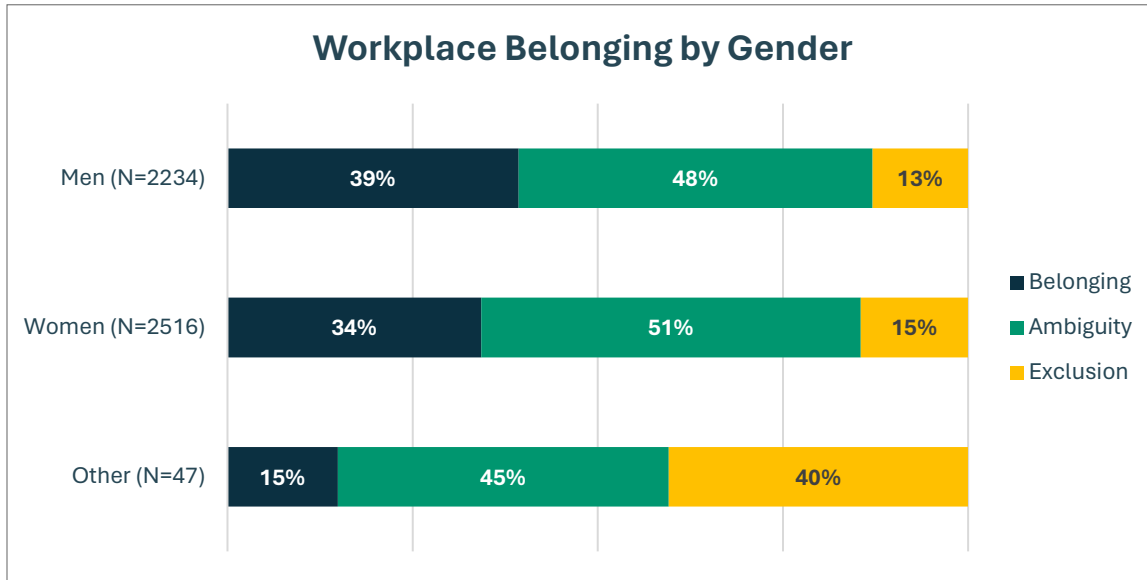
Workplace Belonging by Socioeconomic Status



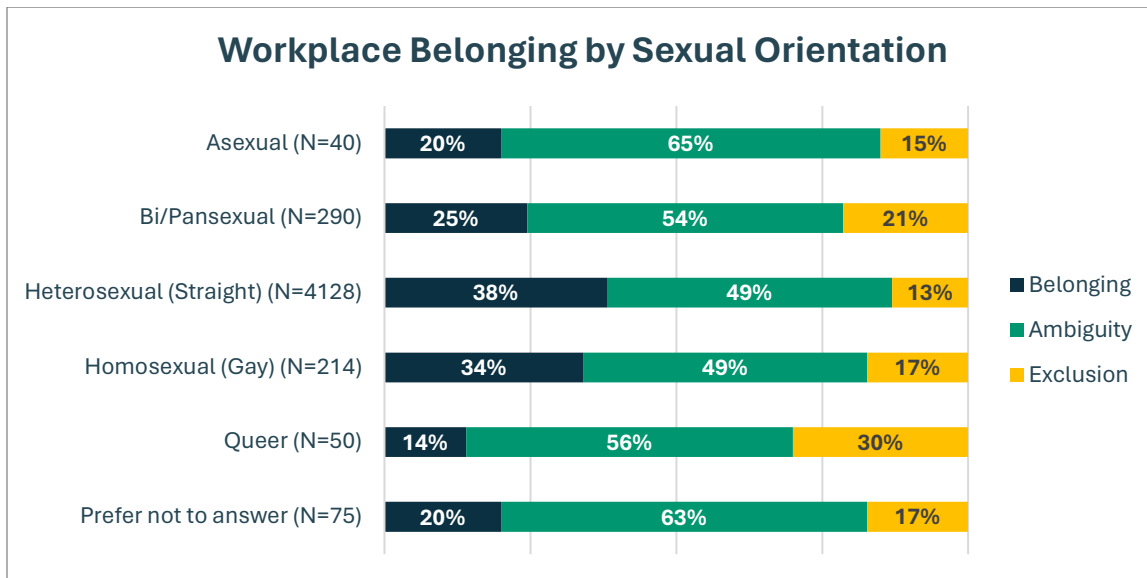

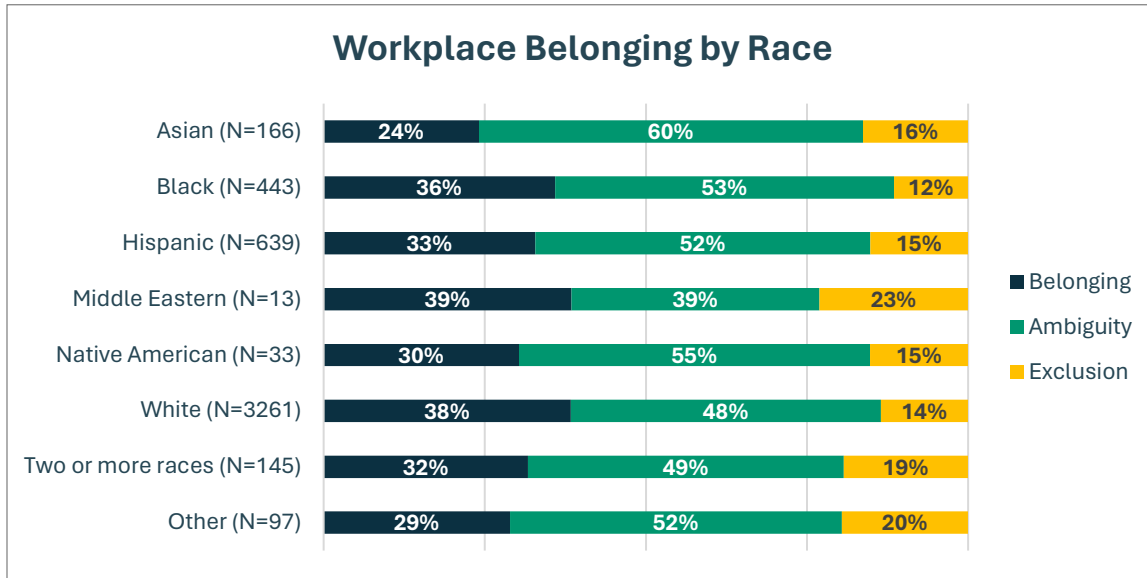

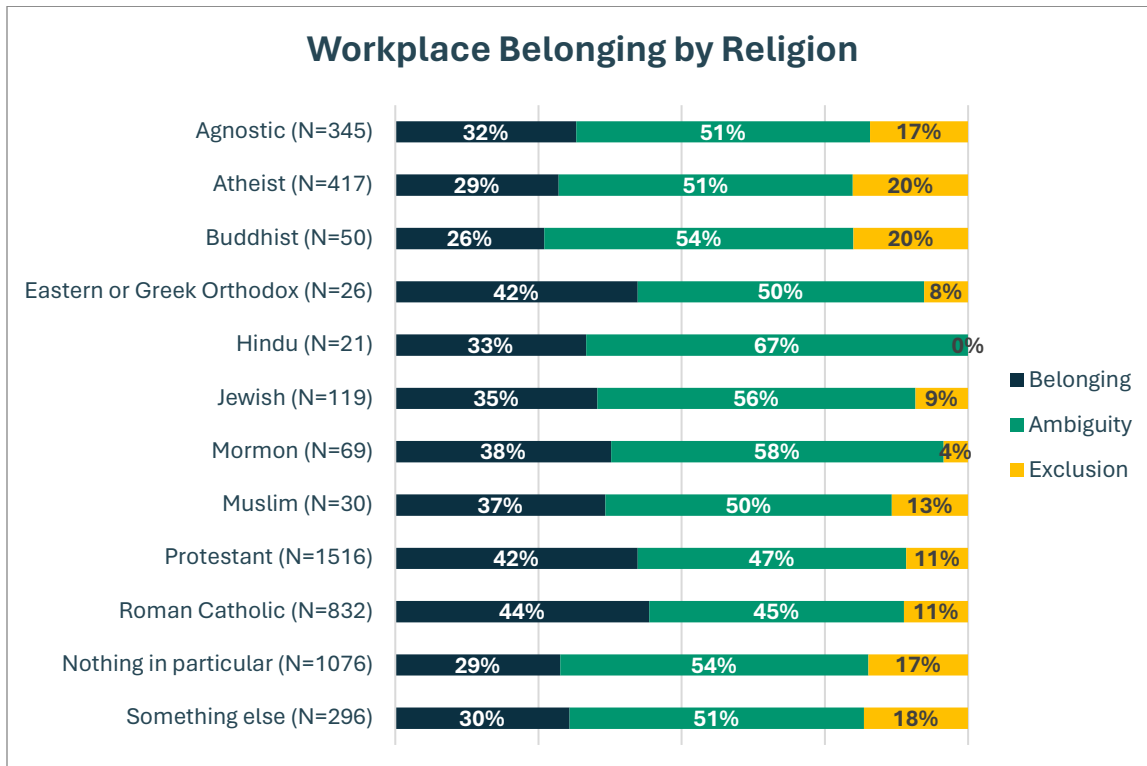
Workplace Belonging by Sexual Orientation



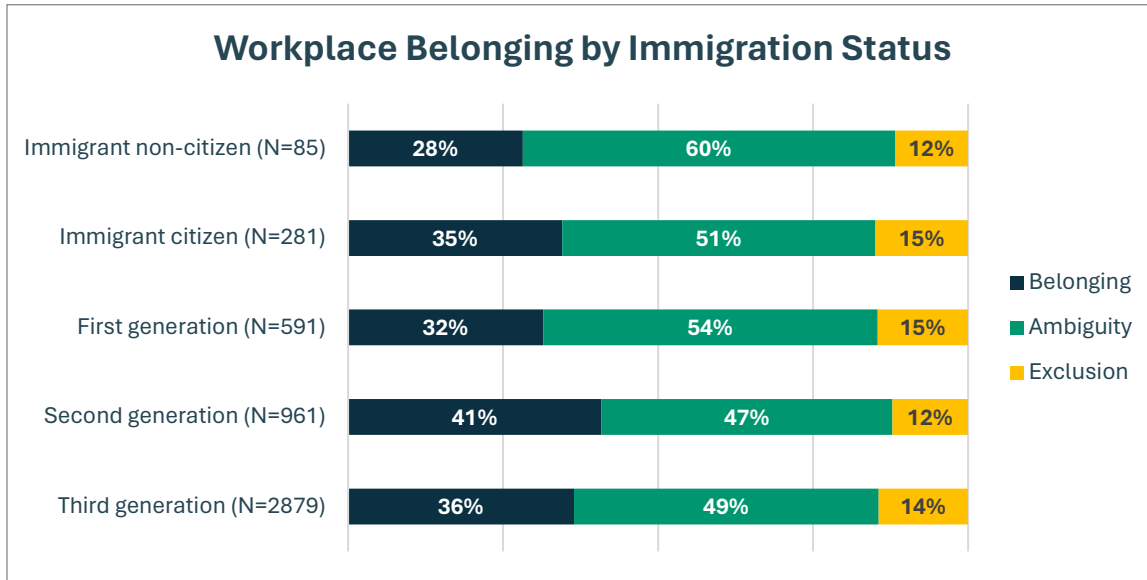

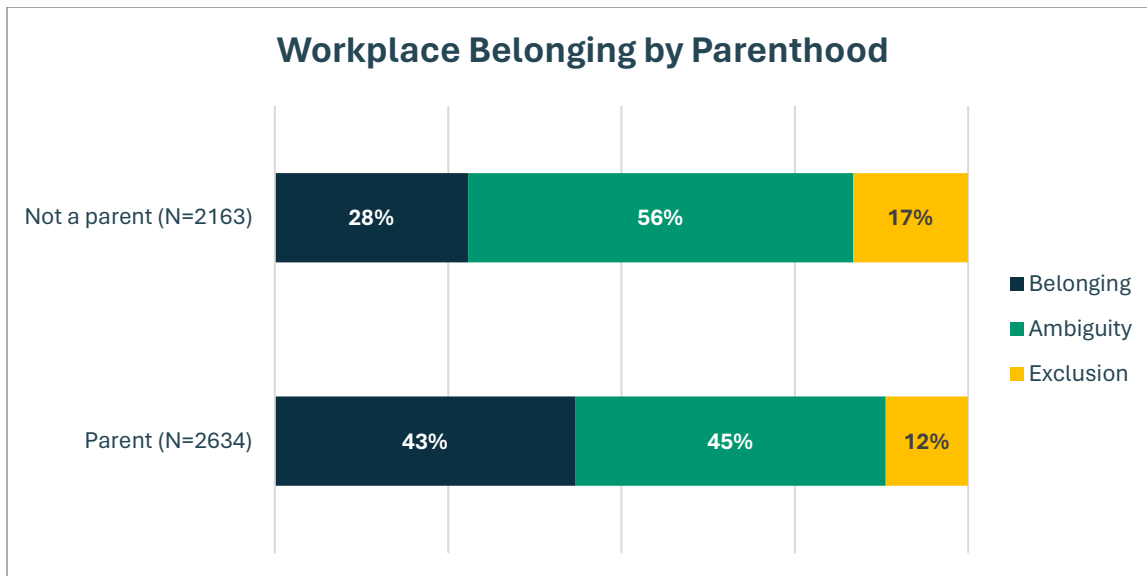

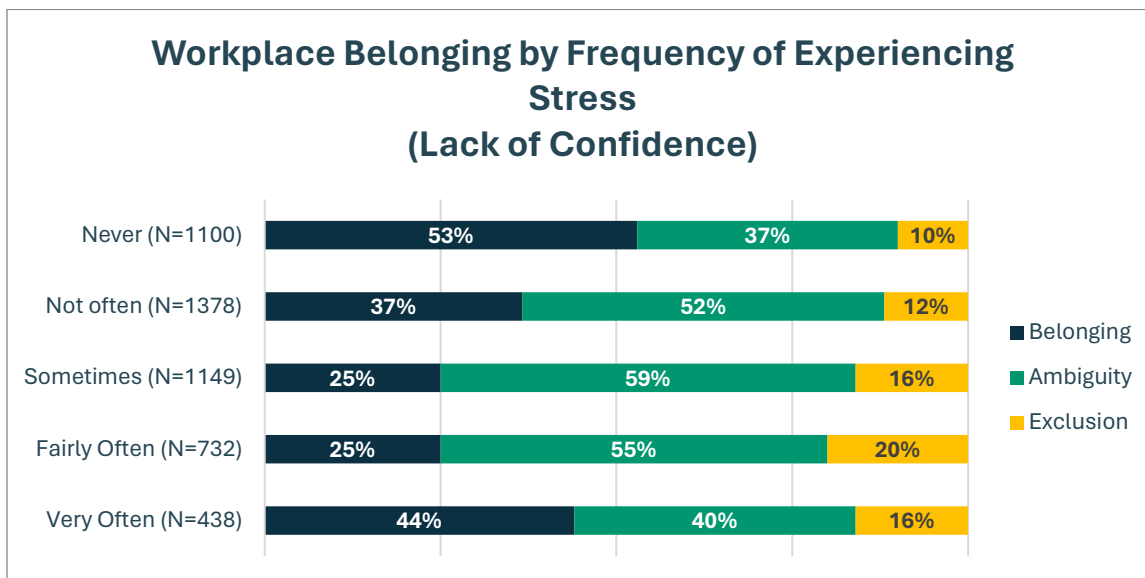

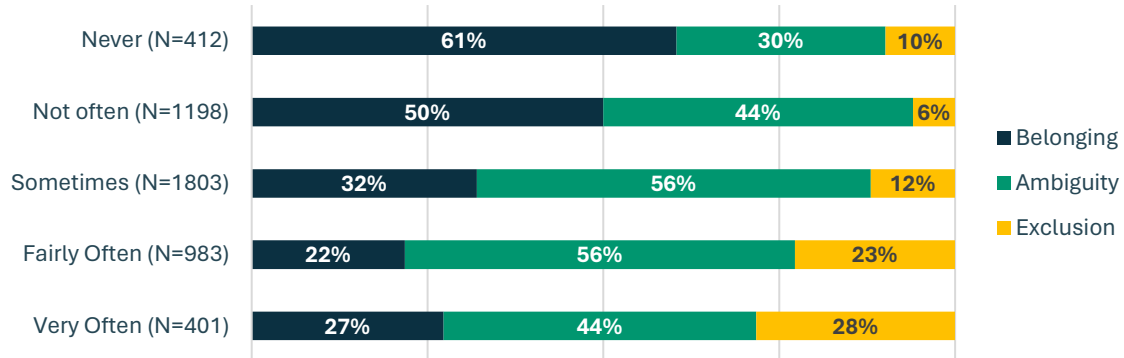


Workplace Belonging by Frequency of Experiencing Stress

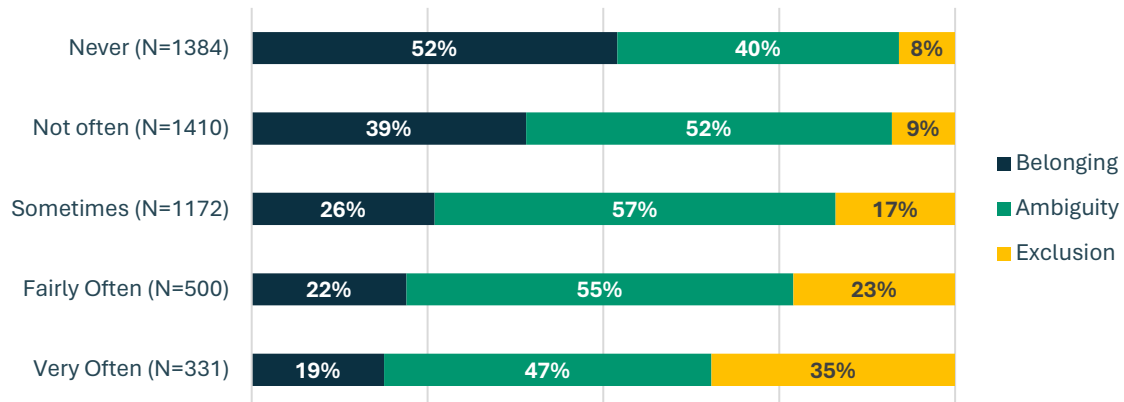

Workplace Belonging by Frequency of Experiencing Stress (Things were Not Going Your Way)



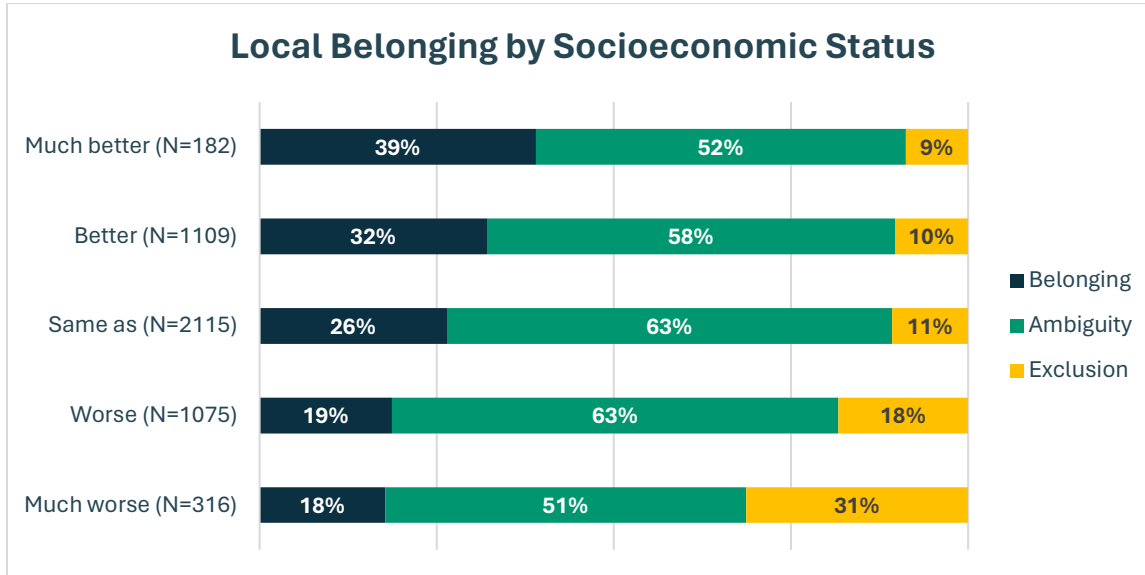

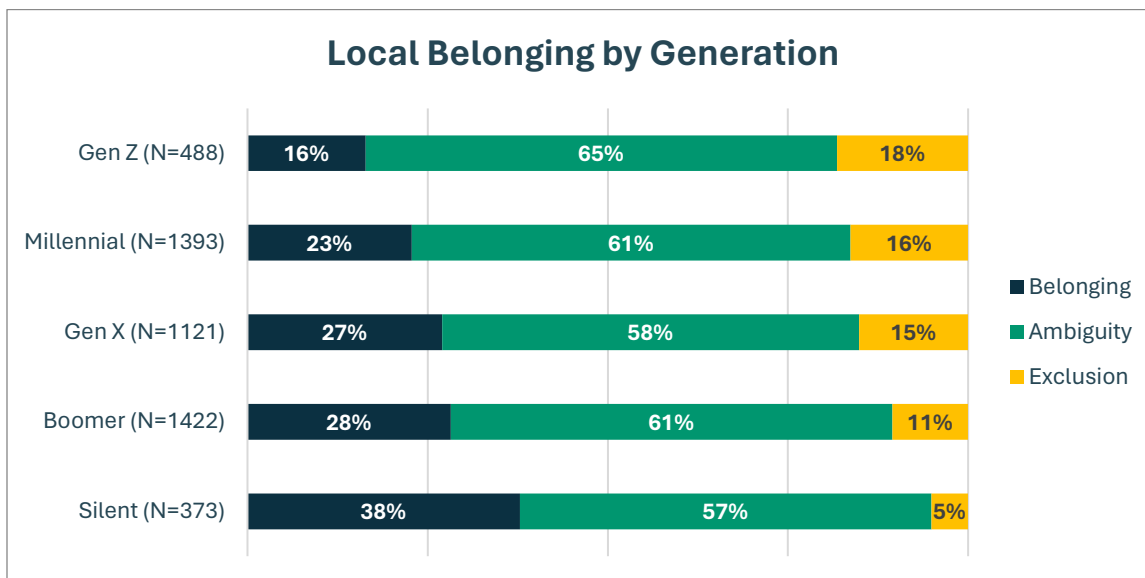

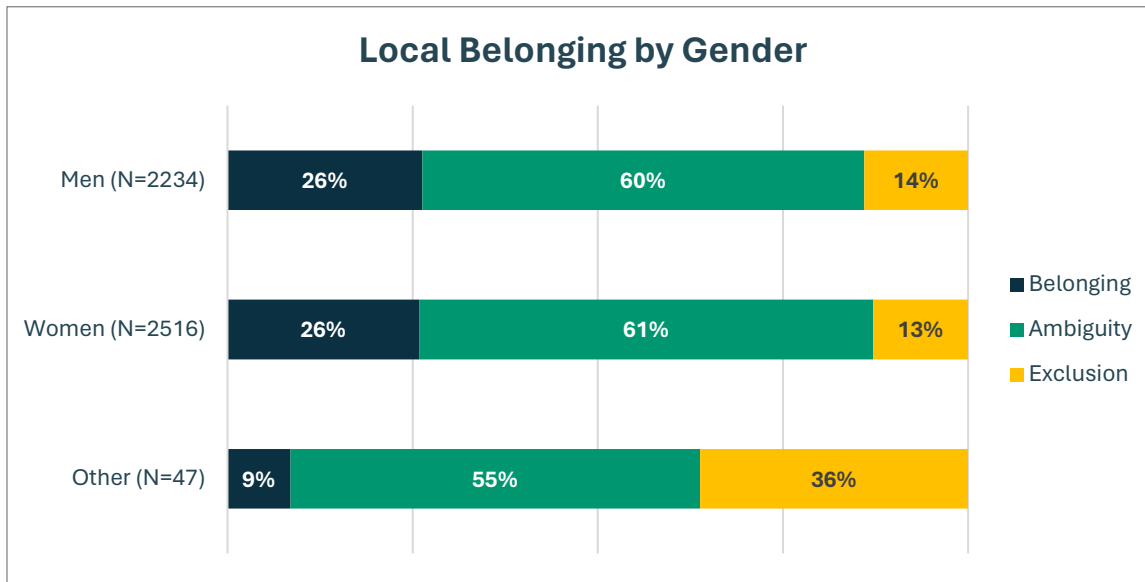

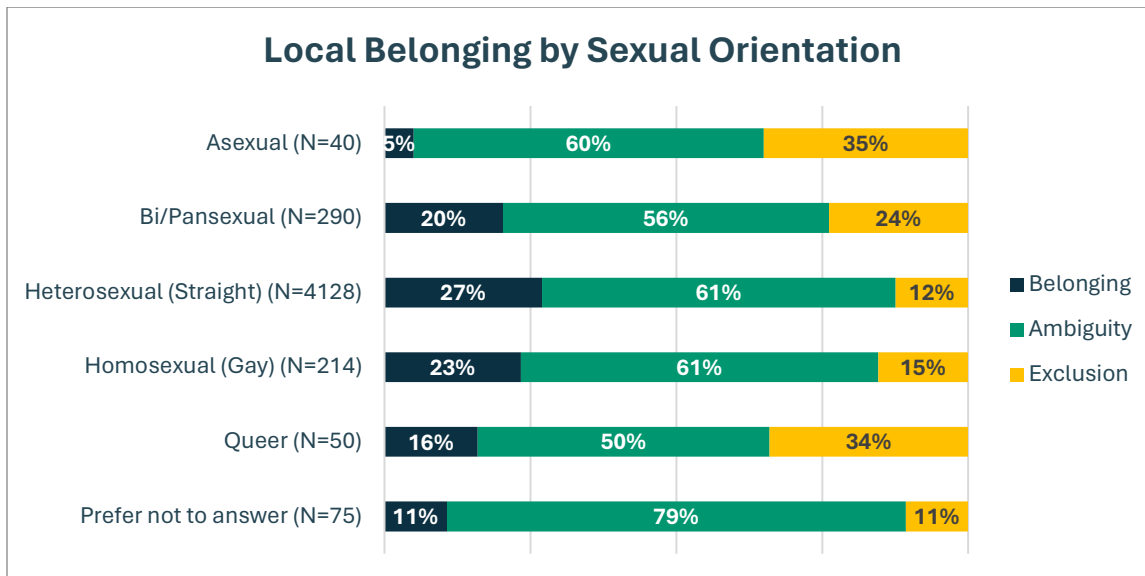

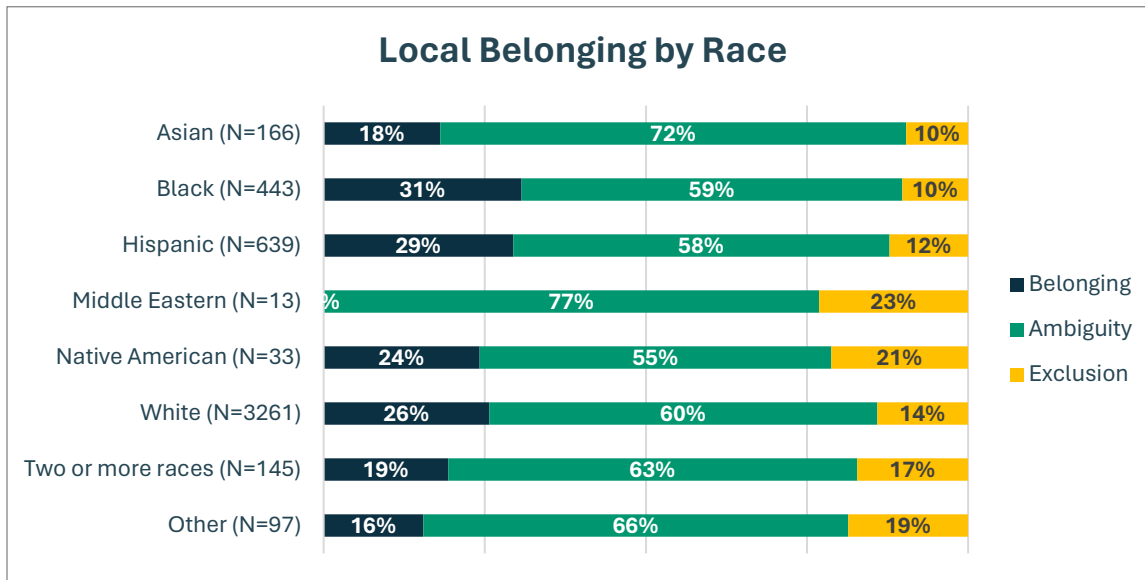

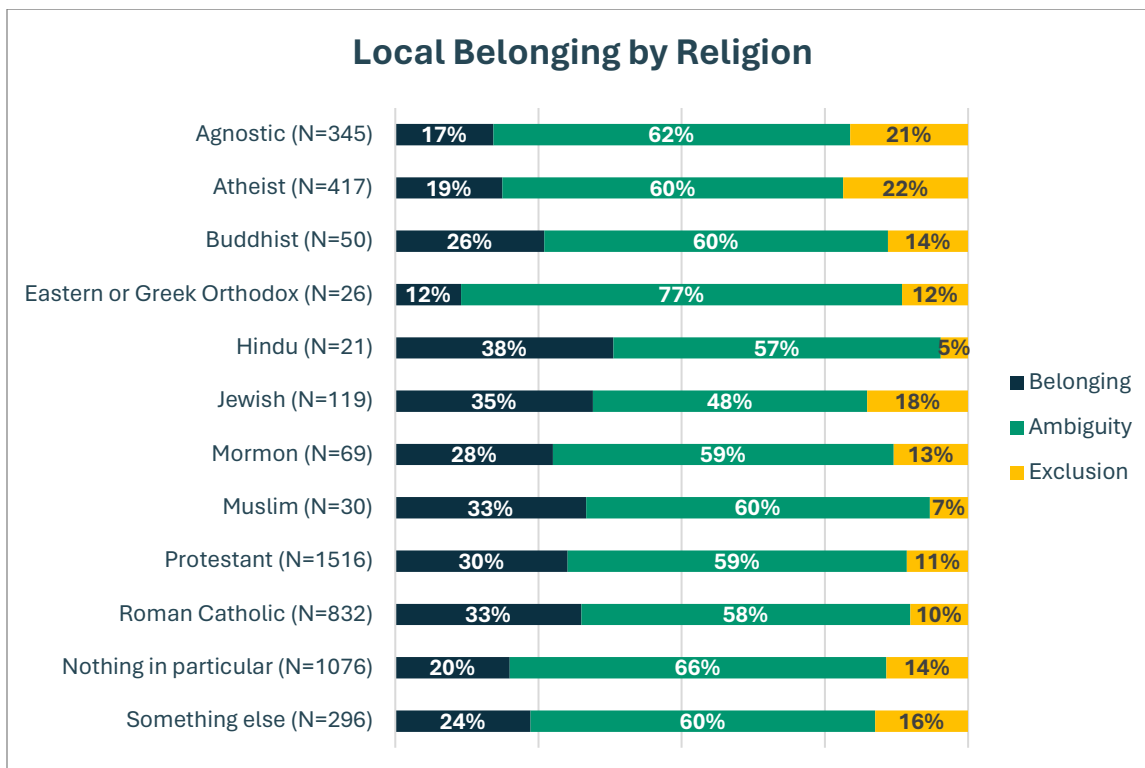

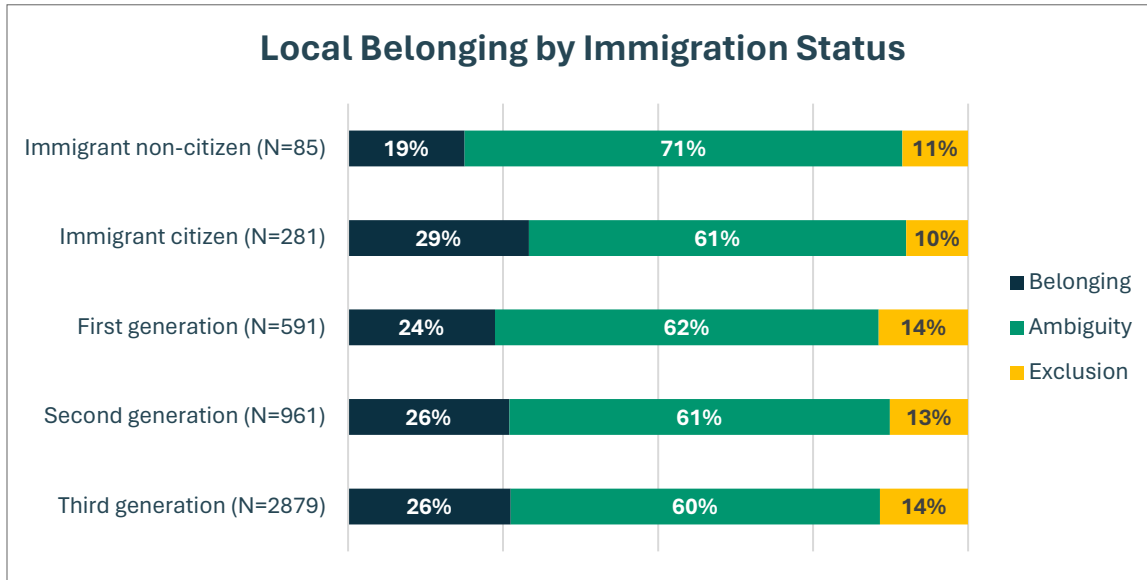

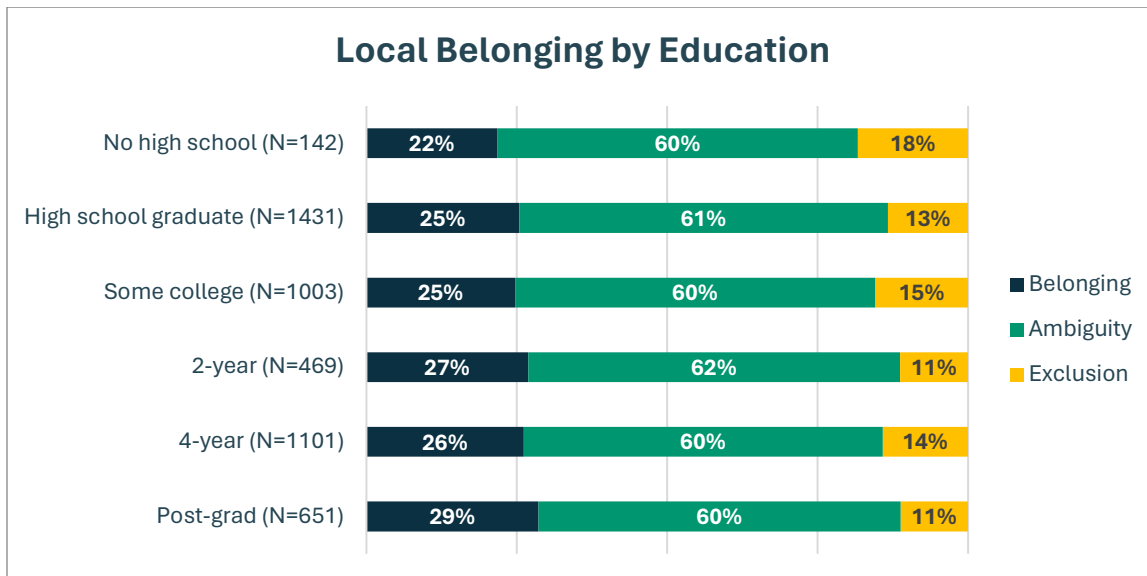

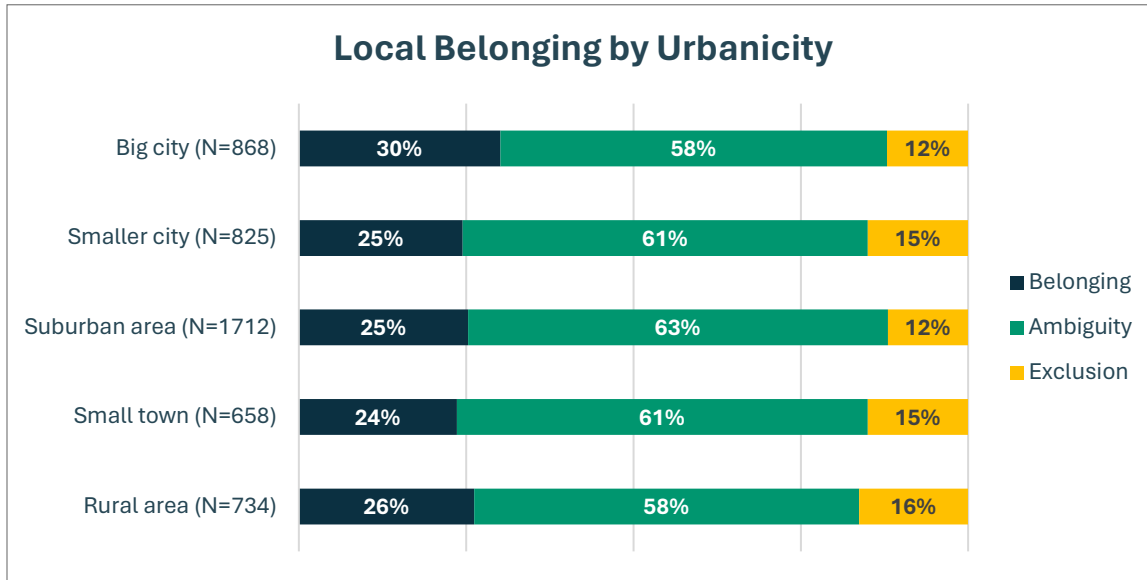

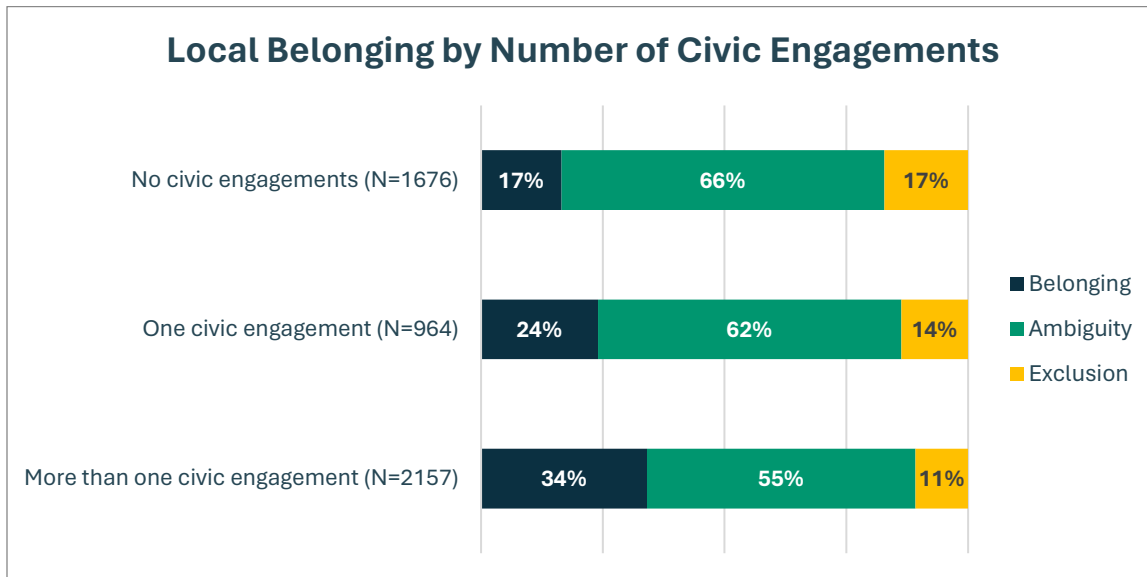

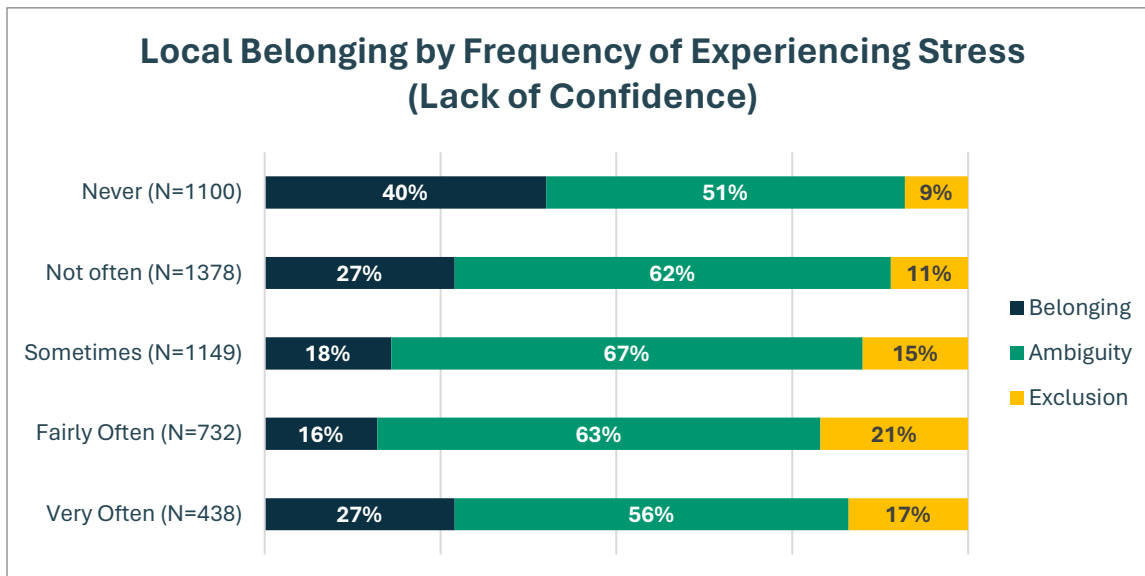
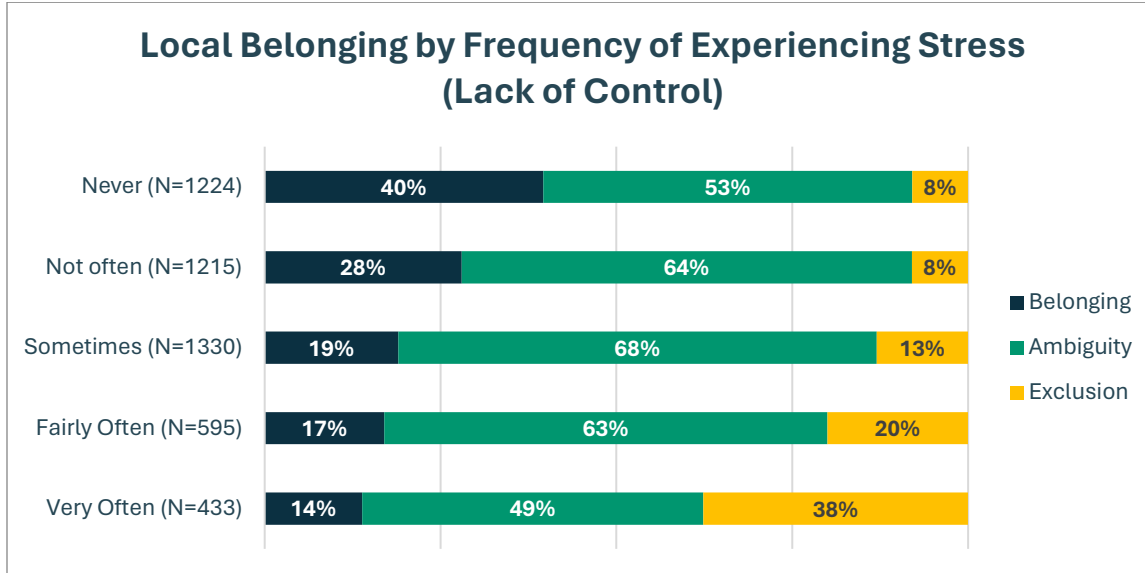
Local Belonging by Number of Civic Engagements

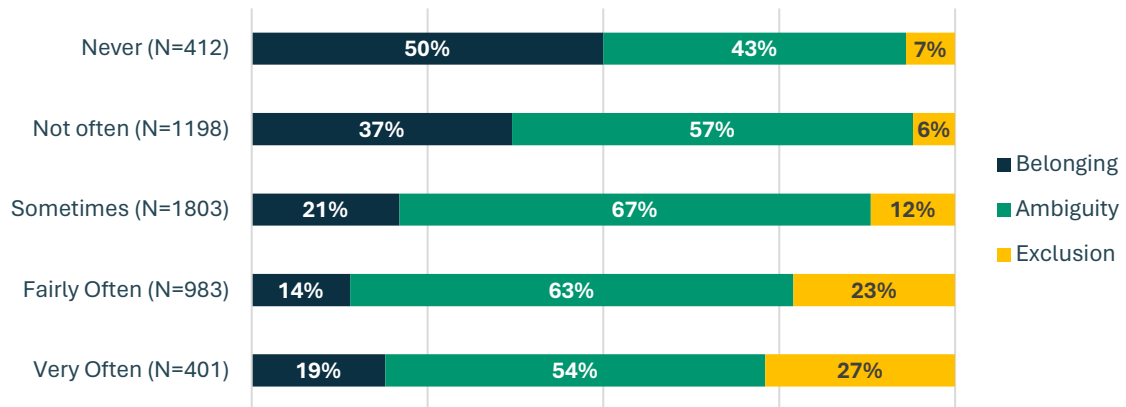


Local Belonging by Frequency of Experiencing Stress

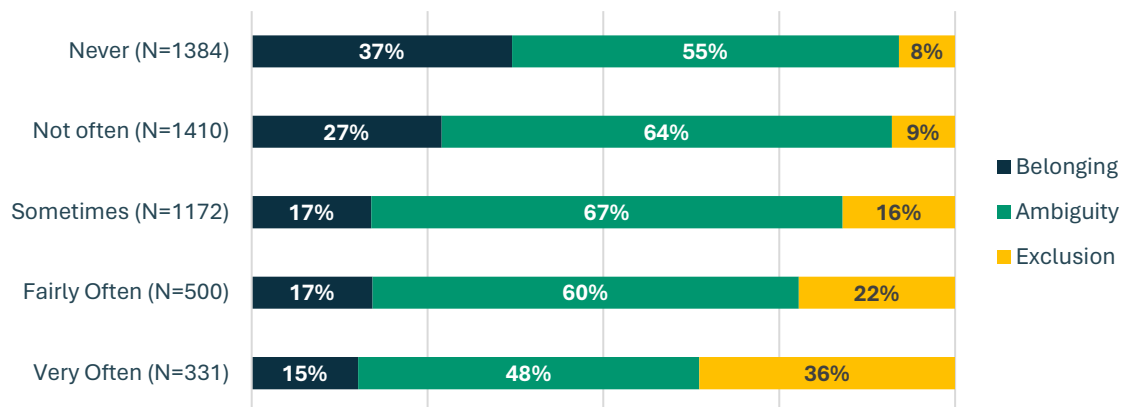

Local Belonging by Frequency of Experiencing Stress (Things were Not Going Your Way)

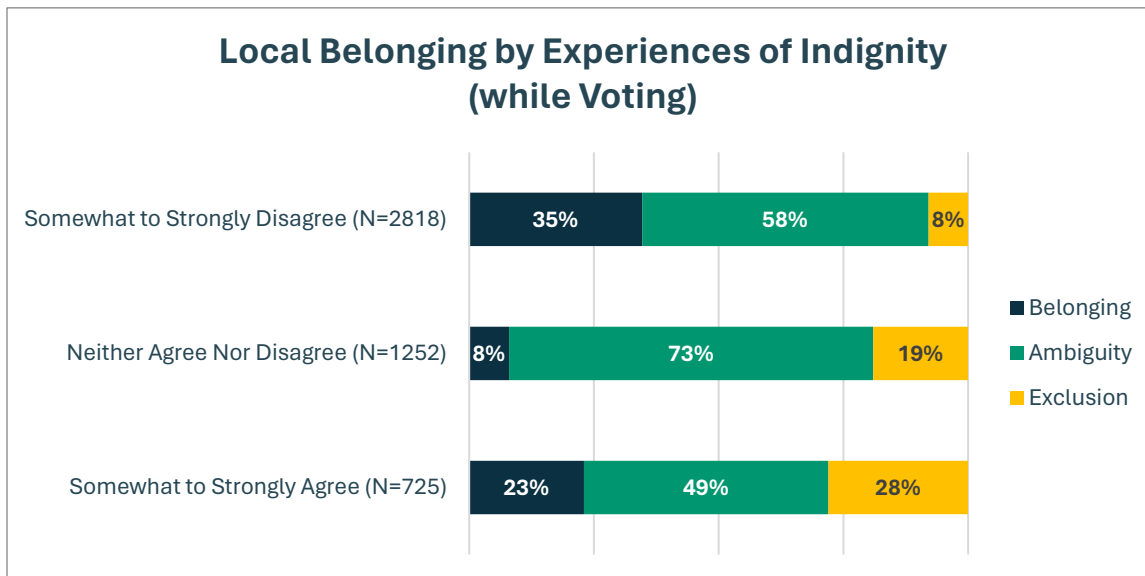
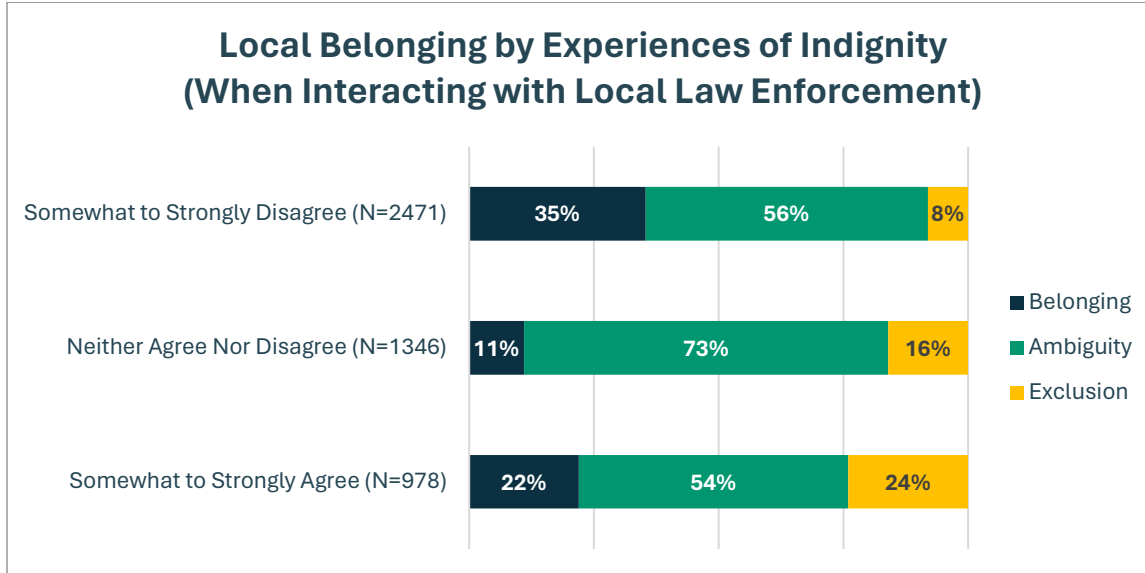

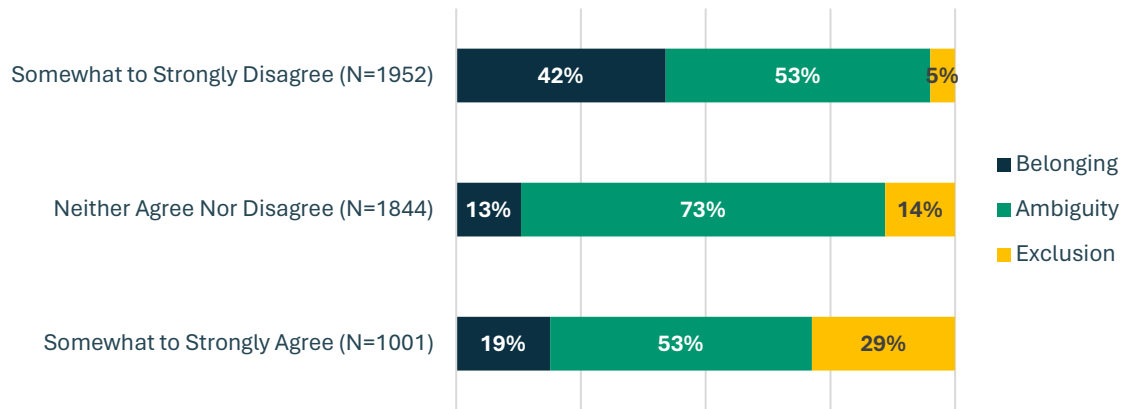


Local Belonging by Experiences of Indignity

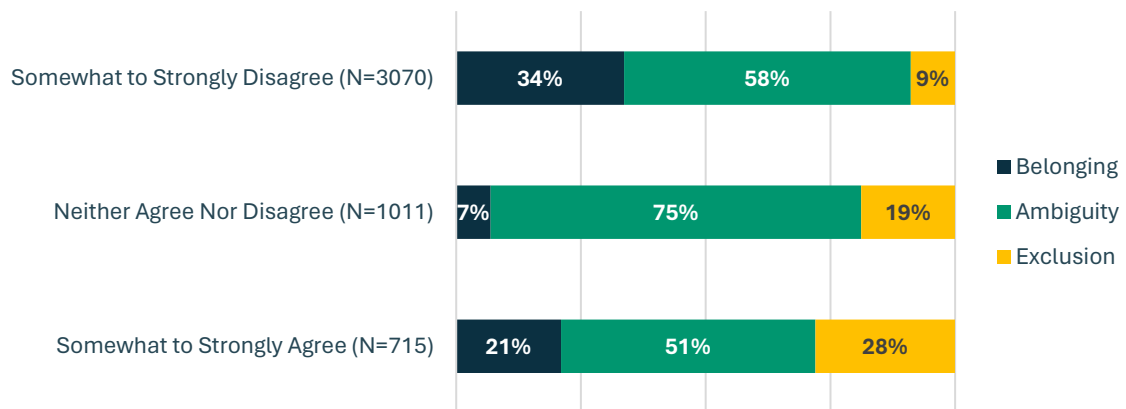

Local Belonging by Experiences of Indignity (When Interacting with Locally Elected Officials)



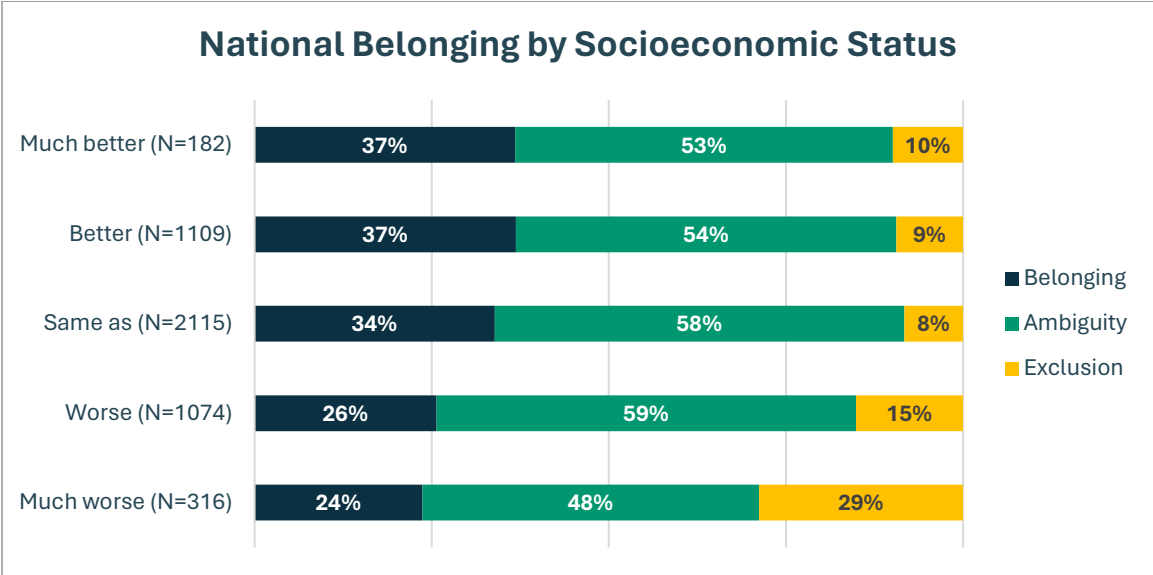

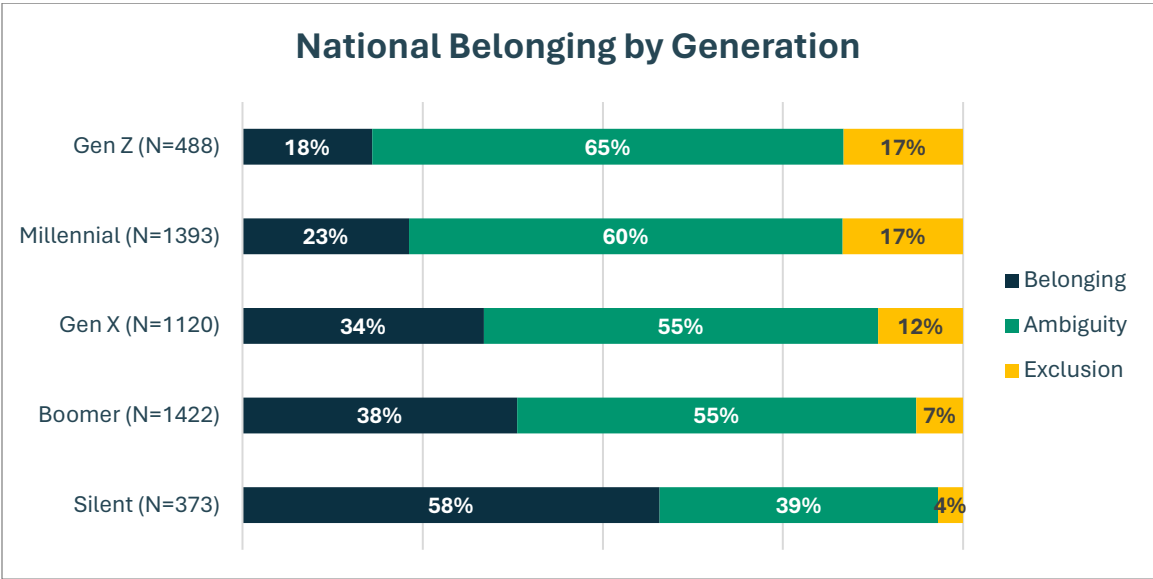

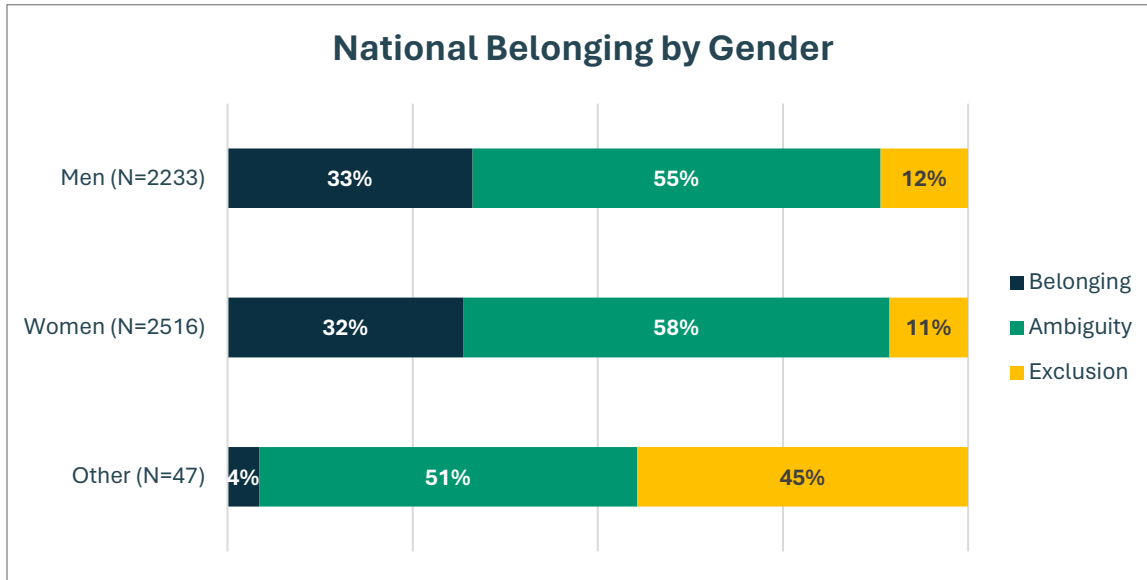
National Belonging by Socioeconomic Status



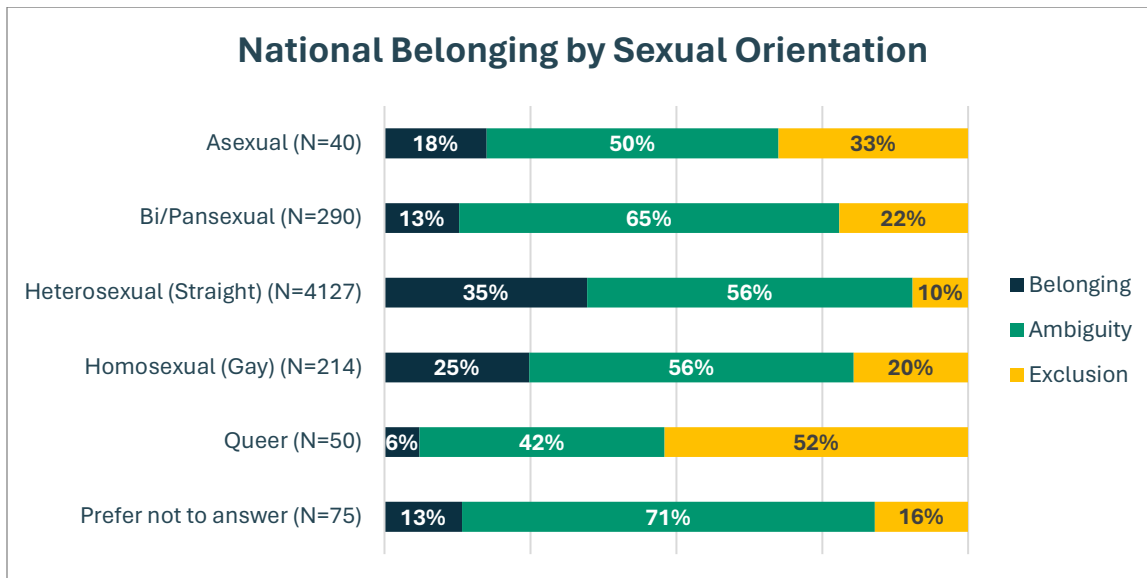

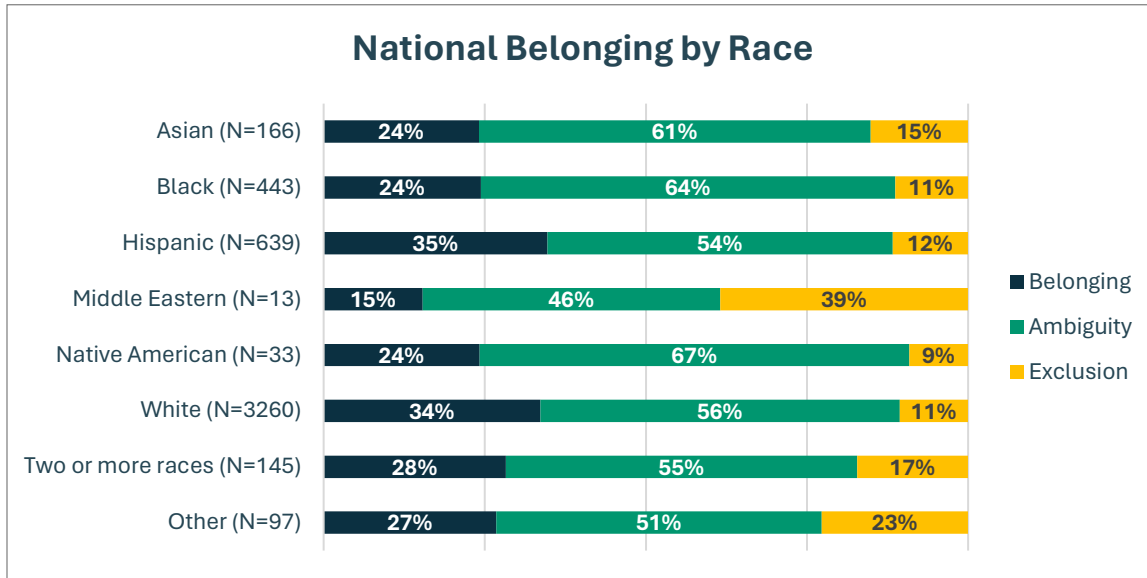

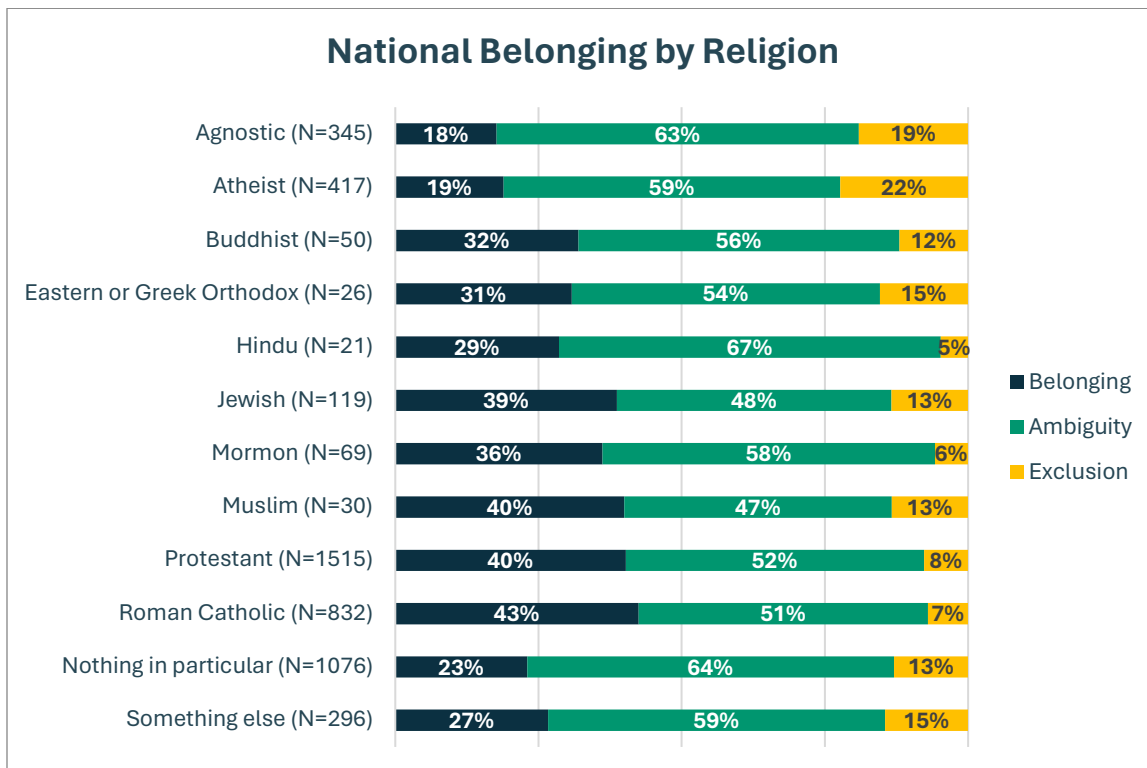

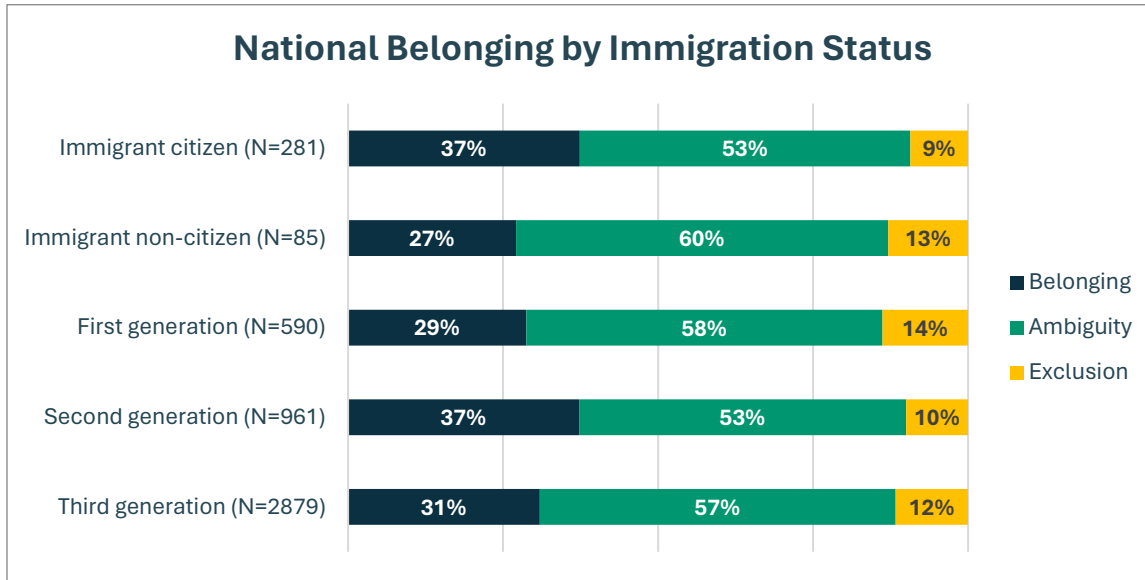
